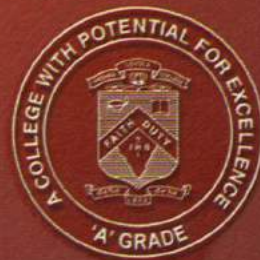

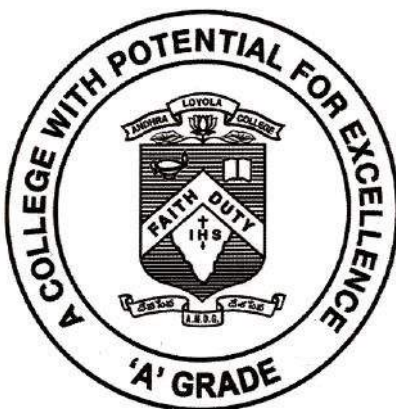

### Library:

The massive expansion spree of the Library continued this academic year too in terms of books and Journals, infrastructure and users.

Addition of a wide range of books on subjects varying from textbooks to religious literature formed part of expansion. And this year's addition of 2160 books to the existing collection included subjects like e-commerce, Bio Technology, Bio-Informatics & globalization. **Subsidized lunch scheme:** The Subsidized Lunch Scheme is an innovative programme of our college. Through this scheme lunch was provided at a subsidized rate to about 132 needy students of our college. The students are selected on the recommendation of the Heads of the Departments.

**Earn while you Learn:** This innovative programme entered its sixth year of implementation with its objective of providing the economically poor and needy students with part time employment out side their class hours to enable them to earn income to meet their personal needs. The students learn about dignity of labour and self-respect. 67 students are making use of this programme and are working in different departments.



**Equal Opportunities Cell (EOC):** This programme is a UGC-sponsored initiative. It aims at providing equal opportunities to students hailing from disadvantaged background. Dr.K.Job sudarshan facilitated the input lessons. The topics were self-confidence, motivation, communication skills, career guidance and leadership. ## Rev. Fr. GORDON

Rev. Fr. A. Theckemury

It was in the Tamil Nadu Hospital, Madras. Fr Gordon was convalescing after his major operation. I was with him day and night. One day when I returned after taking my breakfast in the Hospital canteen, Fr Gordon told me that the phone in the room was ringing for a long time. Naturally he could not get up and attend to the phone. I was just thinking who could have called us. Then he told me "Father Antony - there are four calls. First, there is a call from God - few will respond to that call. Then there is the call of man - many will answer that call. The third kind of call you have to respond - that is the call of nature - otherwise you have to pay for it. Then comes the fourth kind of call - the telephone call. All will rush to answer that call".



Fr Gordon had a subtle sense of humour. The wife of one of our lecturers was promoted on the eve of her retirement as Principal of the Govt. College which was situated in a godforsaken village far away from Vijayawada. She approached Fr Gordon for advice; with a mischievous smile Fr Gordon suggested that she would ask for leave for three months.

"On what grounds" she enquired.

"Maternity leave" - he replied - "SML - Suspected Maternity Leave" he added.

Fr Gordon knew the value of positive stroke. Dr Balachander the young and handsome Doctor of TN Hospitals used to visit Fr Gordon during his morning rounds. One morning, Fr Gordon asked "Doctor, are you married?"

"Oh yes" he replied.

"Thank God", Fr Gordon exclaimed, "otherwise all these girls in the hospital will be after you". Dr complimented Fr Gordon "Father, you are our best patient."

Exactly two weeks before his death, Fr Gordon told Sr Ancy Tom, who was looking after him in St Ann's Hospital, Vijayawada, to send for me. She replied that Fr Theckemury would come in the evening as usual. (I used to spend four to five hours every evening with him) But he insisted that she should call him immediately. I rushed to the hospital. As soon as I entered the room he told me that he would like to speak to me alone. "Please close the doors and window. I have certain problems: get me my tape-recorder". After closing the doors and window I took the tape-recorder which I had brought to the hospital from his room. Casting a glance at it and with a strong disapproval he insisted. "Bring me my tape recorder" I was at a loss; it was his tape-recorder. So, I calmly told him "Father it is yours - not mine; mine is there on that table". He was confused; paused for a moment; then apologetically said, "I am sorry; bring me my hearing-aid"







When I fixed his hearing aid to his ear, he said, 'I am facing certain moral problems, you sit down. My first problem is: for the past several days I am not taking any food (he could take neither solid nor liquid food). They are keeping me alive by these drips. Can't we stop this too' ?

"Father, we are not using any extraordinary means to prolong your life, (when I was taking him to the hospital, he had told me that no extraordinary means should be used to prolong his life). What we are doing is just the normal thing. If we stop this, we will be allowing you to starve to death. I don't think that it is the right thing to do". He seemed to agree to my reply and so moved to his second problem.

"All my major organs are functioning well. Heart, Liver, Kidney... And yet my weight is going down. (It was 59kg; before his operation his weight was 71kg.) How long will I live? Did the Doctors tell you anything"? I did not want to hide from him what Dr Pattabhi Ramaiah M.S had told me a few days earlier when I asked him the same question.

"In the case of cancer patients, it is difficult to predict the end. In some cases the end will come fast. In other cases, the patient will drag on for days - in some cases even for months" - After a few minutes reflection he said, "may be another two weeks more, for Fr Gordon". As I shared with Fr Gordon what Dr Pattabhi had told me I added - 'it can happen even earlier - even tomorrow-and he added may be the day after'? I knew that he was fully prepared to meet his Lord and Master.

"My third problem" - he paused for a moment "you see I am a nuisance to all of you" When I heard that statement, I was upset; with tears I told him, "Father, please do not think that you are a nuisance. It is a privilege for us to serve you; we do this out of love; be assured you are never a burden to us". I could not continue. Both of us remained in silence for some time. Besides, the members of ALC Community, every day the Sanjeevan scholastics took their turn to be at his bedside. For forty days he was never left alone.

His next problem was: "I cannot sleep" A strong dose of sleeping pills resulted in nightmares and the following days he was in a drowsy mood and on such days he spoke incoherently: I promised to discuss the matter with the Doctor and to do what was necessary.

My last problem is the 'visitors' - the good sisters - sometimes they come in a group and at odd hours. The invariable question they put to him was "How are you father"? Fr Gordon was never satisfied to reply in monosyllable. He would narrate to them his operation in detail from the beginning. Often after such an exercise he was left exhausted. I promised to restrict the visitors by putting a notice outside his door - "No visitors - without permission"

We were together for about 40 minutes. His mind was clear and his thinking was logical. He seemed to be relaxed. Then he said "I want to make my confession" Fr Jojaya was his regular confessor. I told him that I would send for him. He replied: "I want to make my confession to you" He made his confession. He looked happy when I left him.





# A JESUIT OF A LEGENDARY BREED

(This does not purport to be either a biographical account or an exact reproduction of the oration given at the funeral Mass)

## FR GORDON'S ILLNESS AND DEATH :

The edifying and inspiring manner in which Fr Gordon accepted his suffering and came to terms with the baffling mystery of the killer disease cancer will merit a separate account by itself. Throughout his illness he tried to retain his sense of humour. His ready sense of appreciation for all that the doctors and nurses did for him and for the exemplary assistance and caring support extended to him by the members of Andhra Loyola College Community in general and by Fr Theckemury and Fr Amalanathan in particular remained undiminished. The patience with which he coped with the pain and discomfort was something out of the ordinary. It would have required all the spiritual strength he could muster, to reconcile himself to the visible ravages that the dreadful dis-ease of cancer wrought on his physique. As the final days approached, all intake of food ceased, he was drastically reduced in weight and he became incredibly feeble appearing like a pale shadow of his former self. But none of these could stamp out his innate nobility and his characteristic serenity and composure. By all accounts, he had a premonition of his imminent end. He appeared to have assiduously prepared himself for his final journey. He called for his Community members, blessed them, received Communion, joined in the recitation of the prayer "Soul of Christ, sanctify me" with unusual unction, and gradually entered into a phase of quiet repose. Then somewhere between the final hours of Good Friday and the early hours of Holy Saturday, his gentle soul effortlessly took wings and merged into eternity. What a blessed way and a blessed day to commend his soul to God, completing his participation into the sacred mysteries of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection!

So towering and truly multi-faceted a personality was Fr Douglas Michael Gordon that I felt a-sense of privilege as well as a sense of unworthiness when told to say a few words on the sad and sombre occasion when we had assembled to bid him our final and fond farewell, farewell that was also reverential and prayerful. About twenty five years ago as a first year student of Philosophy at Shembaganur, in Kodaikanal Hills, I was among those present outside the Jesuit residence on the roadside, all agog, awaiting the arrival of the newly appointed Provincial for his annual visitation. We did not have to cool our heels for long in the mild sun of that fresh morning. For the bus that was clambering up the hill heaved to a stop near us and there emerged a tall and impressive figure with what looked like a week-end luggage. Accustomed as we were to the awe-inspiring solemnity associated with





the visit of the previous Provincials we had seen earlier, there was something refreshing about the simplicity of the new Provincial Fr Gordon, coming by the public transport bus instead of the customary car of his office. His brief but witty speech in the dining hall assuring us that he would see us 'in detail' confirmed the favourable impression we had gained of him as an affable and amiable Provincial. However, it was about ten years later that I was to get the privilege of beginning a friendly association with him which would enable me to see his rich and versatile personality 'in detail'.

From 1978 when he happened to be my Rector at Andhra Loyola College to the present day I had never wavered in my opinion that Fr Gordon was undoubtedly, a man of magnificent calibre and stature in every way. Rarely do we see in a man such an amazing combination of diverse talents and charisms. Seldom do we see in a single person such an enviable spectrum of endearing human qualities, sound and solid virtues, intellectual endowments and academic achievements, artistic aptitudes and administrative acumen, an astonishingly retentive memory and a magnanimous 'heart, a veritable mine of general knowledge and above all the gift of a noble soul. Even a cursory glance at the salient and significant landmarks in his life will reveal Fr Gordon's extraordinary degree of flexibility to adapt himself to different places and situations when called upon to serve the Society in different capacities. Being Provincial for two terms both in the pre-Vatican and post-Vatican eras, he was a witness to the varying and shifting trends within the Society of Jesus. Through it all, his ardent love for the Society and his uncompromising attachment to its finest traditions remained unchanged.

### A PRIEST IN THE SOCIETY OF JESUS:

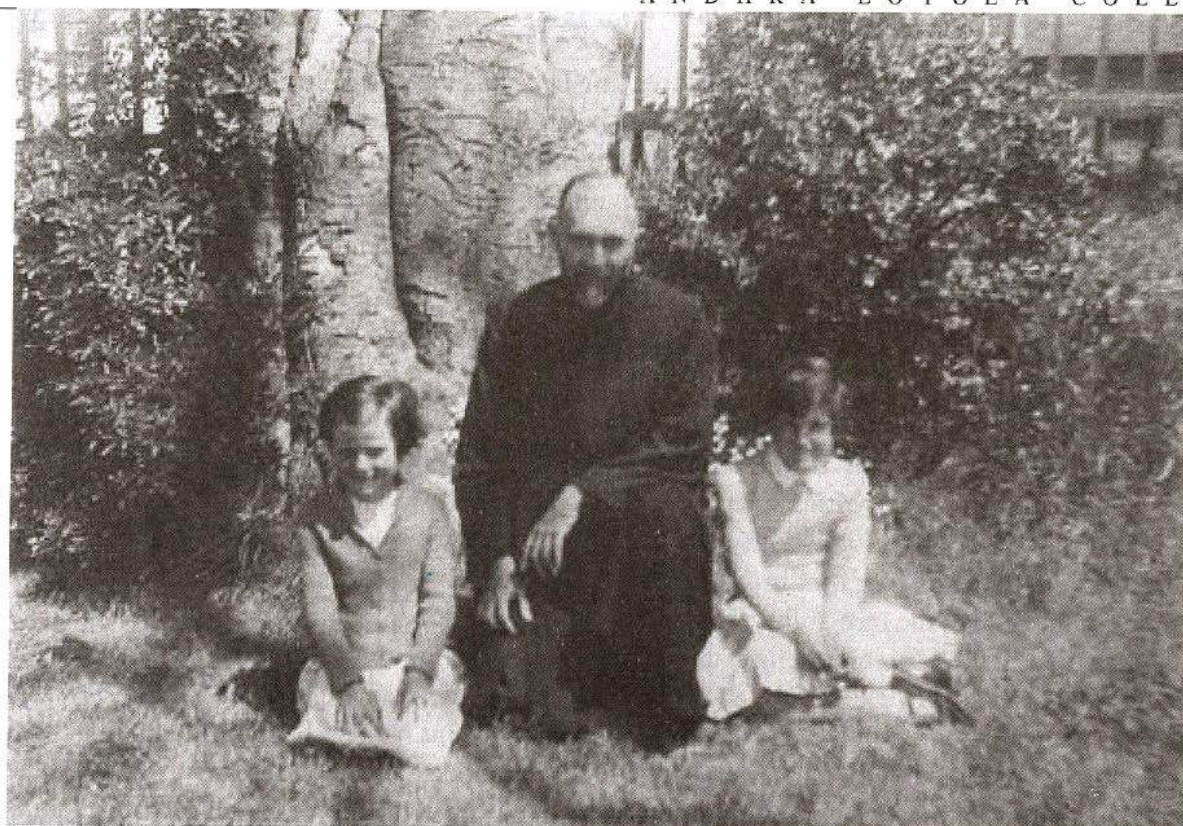
Though young Douglas was more than usually gifted both intellectually and artistically, he did not seriously consider opting for a lucrative career in the world. For, the seed of vocation to priesthood had been planted early in his impressionable years and was nurtured during his studies at Loyola College, Madras, when he came under the spell of such Jesuit stalwarts as Fr Murphy and Fr Bertram. The decision to join the Society of Jesus, therefore, was natural and predictable development. He valued his vocation to priesthood in the Society as a priceless gift for which he was ready to sacrifice everything. More than the different offices he held, it is the exercise of his priestly ministry that he most cherished. In a brief autobiographical account that he wrote shortly before his hospitalization consequent on the detection of a cancerous growth, he considered the three years of his ordination, the happiest period in his life. So deep was his love for the Society, that in later years, whenever he made allusions to St Ignatius in public speeches, his voice would invariably get choked.

### HIS SOLID AND JOYFUL SPIRITUALITY:

Fr Gordon's spirituality as a loyal son of St Ignatius remained solidly rooted in and was sustained by his undeviating love of Jesus. His entire life conformed to the biblical image of the man who put his hand to the plough and never looked back. He was unswervingly faithful to the supportive elements which nourished his spirituality, like personal prayer, fervent daily celebration of the Eucharist, readiness to serve his Community in whatever way he could, and a genuine love for the poor and disadvantaged. His spirituality was that of a cheerful







giver and not that of a glum and morose ascetic. It was not an overly demonstrative kind which produced a streak of self-righteousness of a holier-than-thou attitude.

### **HIS NEVER-CEASING INTEREST IN PEOPLE AND INSTITUTIONS:**

Fr Gordon's spirituality so far from being self-centred, flowed incessantly into the whole network of his relationships with people and institutions. It was this which accounted for his insatiable thirst for news about people and institutions. He had a particular fondness for the new apostolic ventures launched in the Province and kept himself abreast of the latest developments in them. Fr Gordon's interest in the Society of Jesus was not so hidebound as to be confined to the Provinces of Andhra and Tamil Nadu with which he was closely connected. His vision of the Society was truly universal and it is this which turned him "into an avid and voracious reader of the newsletters emanating from different Jesuit Provinces.

### **HIS SPECIAL LOVE FOR THE POOR :**

Throughout his life Fr Gordon had an instinctive love for the economically disadvantaged students. This was particularly evident not only during his tenures as Rector and Principal but also during his years of retirement. The gifts he had received from his brother and sister in England were channeled into helping the poor students and this was always done through the Treasurer of the House as he was averse to handling money himself. What was remarkable about the helps he had given and what the beneficiaries of his assistance valued most and were deeply indebted to him for, was the fact that these helps were given at the time they needed most and that they were done in the most unobtrusive and



uncondescending manner and without expecting to reap a harvest of future gratitude. He took in his stride the snide remark made by some that he was being exploited by students making specious and spurious appeals for his help. But in his judgment, it was better to be cheated ninety nine times than to turn away one individual in genuine need of his help. The flood of affectionate tributes that filled the visitors' book in the wake of his demise abundantly testifies to this compassionate and magnanimous attitude of Fr Gordon.

### A MAN WHO WAS FULLY HUMAN AND FULLY ALIVE:

Fr Gordon was consistently cheerful even to the point of being vivacious and boisterous at times when the situation warranted. He was at his lively best during the regular recreations, regaling the Community with a string of amusing anecdotes and incisive comments, plunging into an animated discussion with all the cut and thrust of a political debate and fiercely arguing and defending a point in favour of the underdog but always with his unfailing sense of humour. He had the rare ability to laugh at himself and to enjoy an explosive joke cracked at his expense. Of particular delight and hilarity to the Community was what was facetiously referred to as his "*REFECTORY ORATORY*". He had the heart of a child to relish the assorted cartoons that appeared in the daily and Sunday papers. But he also had the intellectual bent of mind to grapple with the most intractable clues of a crossword puzzle. One always had the feeling that the atmosphere in the community was lit up with the radiance of Fr Gordon's gentle and urbane humour.

### FR GORDON A STOREHOUSE OF INFORMATION:

No matter what the subject discussed was, Fr Gordon could always be counted upon to throw some light on it. Amazing were the range of interests he cultivated and the fund of general knowledge he had accumulated over the years. It was another veteran Jesuit Fr Subbaiah who once made this apt assertion. "What Fr Gordon does not know is not worth knowing". This was the reason why a word with Fr Gordon was **de rigueur** for all the major decisions connected with the College and the Community. Having had the benefit of a long administrative experience, Fr Gordon naturally became very knowledgeable and proficient in matters relating to the laws of the Society of Jesus. He was the prime consultant of the Province when some knotty legal points had to be resolved. The commendable command of Latin he had, stood him in good stead while elucidating and interpreting some complex points in any official document of the Society.

### FR GORDON'S INNER DISCIPLINE AND TRANQUILITY:

Fr Gordon's inner discipline, serenity and equanimity found its expression in the all-pervasive neatness and order he maintained around him. Everything about his room was kept tidy and shipshape. He knew exactly what things were kept where. In the course of my stay at A.L.C. Community, I have had occasion to approach him for sundry articles ranging from a back number of a journal to an old fashioned button for a cassock. Never had he to search for any of these items even for a moment. He would zero in on the exact place where the requisitioned article was kept and hand it over to me with a smile of satisfaction. The same methodical and systematic approach the same meticulous attention to details was brought





to bear upon anything he did. It was implicitly axiomatic with him that if anything was worth doing, it was worth doing well.

#### A MAN OF GOLDEN MEAN:

One feature of his life that was ever in evidence was that he would never do anything in excess. He was a man of moderation, regularity and refinement in all his personal habits. Everything had its place and time whether it was going for his daily walk with Fr Kuriakose or listening to the news bulletin in his rickety transistor. Never could he reconcile himself to wasting anything, be it a polythene bag or other odds and ends which could come in handy for his own or others' use. Whenever he could, he would rather deftly recycle old envelopes than use new ones. Simplicity of lifestyle and religious poverty remained the recognizable hallmarks of his life.

#### FR GORDON, EVERY INCH A GENTLEMAN:

Fr Gordon was a gentleman to the core and would never deliberately cause hurt and 'pain to others. He would go out of his way to show his concern for others and put them at their ease. Any letter written to him would be promptly replied to and it was an unalloyed pleasure reading his letters written in fluent and flawless English and his elegant and impeccably neat hand. He was adept in bridging the generation gap as he could converse with the young and the old with equal ease and facility. He made himself useful in many ways even during his years of retirement. The community relied on him for drafting any important document and he was an accomplished obituary writer for 'CARITAS'.

He officiated, till he was immobilised by his illness, as the Library Warden of the College and maintained order in the Reading Room of the Fathers' Residence. His sensitive and refined soul shrank from anything that was in disarray and he would quietly restore the same to order. This was seen in the way he would tirelessly arrange the newspapers on the reading table every time others left them in shambles. If some pages in the missal in the Chapel were found torn, he would artistically mend them. If any domestic item was damaged or broken by others, he would ingeniously try his skill in putting the pieces together in proper shape. All this was done unasked and without drawing undue attention to himself. He functioned as the local meteorologist, maintained up-to-date chart of the temperature and rainfall, and during the monsoon and summer, a comparative study of the rainfalls and the temperatures of the previous years would be put up for the Community's perusal.

#### THE END OF AN ERA:

The passing away of Fr Gordon marks the end of an era and the fading away of one of the finest generations. Never have I seen such a harmonious blend and a delicate fusion of the human and spiritual. 'Grace builds on Nature' has never been more tellingly and emphatically proved than in the case of Fr Gordon. In his truly remarkable span of life, he touched the destinies of many institutions and the lives of countless individuals. Innumerable were the people who felt uplifted and ennobled by his sage counsel, genial conversation and his spar-king humour. Many had been the beneficiaries of his be-nevolent and timely assistance.





It was a benediction and a blessing for anyone to have come into contact with him. I, for one, count myself immensely lucky to have lived with him and laughed with him in the same Jesuit Community and to have received some measure of his affection and concern. A feeling of gratitude to God wells up in my heart that he had moulded such a person as Fr Gordon. The beautiful setting in which the funeral Mass was held, underscored and accentuated the beautiful culmination of his life. The trees around the Xavier Hostel were steadily and sweetly dropping their golden coloured flowers around the place where his body was kept for the Mass. The symbolism of a gentle shower of rain, soon after his death and just before the funeral Mass was not lost on the vast assembly of admirers who had gathered to accompany him on his last journey.

Good-bye Fr Gordon! You were God's gift to the Society of Jesus, a gift to Andhra Pradesh, a gift to the A.L.C. Community and a gift to everyone who had the privilege of knowing you.

## Fr D. GORDON: AN ALTRUIST

Fr. D. Gordon belongs to rare group of men who are salt of the earth and light of the world. Personalities of this category are capable of turning this world into a happy paradise, with their human concern and philanthropy. The motto of Fr. Gordon was, ad maiorem deo gloriam i.e., everything for the greater glory of God. This motto was clubbed with another ideal of 'everything for the happier life of man'. Carlyle somewhere exhorts that the history of the world is the biography of great men. Fr. Gordon was such a great man that had added a glittering and glorious page to history.

His erudite scholarship colleague with extraordinary pedagogy made him an eminent and inspiring teacher. An educationist says that rare courage and rarer wisdom are needed to enter the classroom. Fr. Gordon had both rare courage and rarer wisdom because frequently he updated the knowledge of the subject he taught with a fervent interest and enthusiasm.

His childlike innocent smile had a magic touch that soothed the troubled minds of many a student of his for whom he was a guardian angel and Godfather nurturing them under his protective wings with great care and attention.

A gentleman to the core, he personified all the noble qualities of a gentleman that were propounded by Cardinal Henry Newman. Remaining always above narrow parochial ideas of caste, creed, community, country, continent etc., he did everything to dignify the human being and kindle the sparks of positive faculties in such a human being. He was undoubtedly the citizen of the world.

Several are the anecdotes, episodes and incidents that speak volumes about the magnanimous, humane and scholarly qualities of Fr. Gordon, but space is a constraint to narrate all of them in a brief writing and so I confine myself to two of them.

When I joined Andhra Loyola, Fr. Gordon didn't know that I had lost my mother at the age of three and my father at five. I narrated these facts to my senior pal late Prof. C. Musili stating that I had faint memory of my mother's death and about the death of my father. I told that he was a teacher and catechist in a remote small village now bordering Andhra and Karnataka. Every Sunday he was going to nearby huts of the labourers that came to dig irrigational canal for Thungabhadra dam all the way from Palamuru - to teach catechism and hymns to the kids. Once the inmates of the huts were attacked by cholera and while serving them without caring for his life, breathed his last, himself becoming the victim of cholera. Fr. Gordon was very much moved by hearing about it from my pal and





started taking special care of me, declaring before other priests "he is my child". I was really lucky to enjoy the munificence of Fr. Gordon in a special way.

My pal Musili was very good at studies, breaking records in the university examinations. Unfortunately, he had traumatic experience because of white patches on one of his legs. Fr. Gordon couldn't see his suffering. So immediately after the examinations, he sent him to Madras for treatment. The salutary effect was, he was cured of it and the Good Samaritan in Fr. Gordon was very much elated.

Much more can be written about this eminent Jesuit's multifaceted personality. I consider him as the most unforgettable character I have ever met because, as noble altruist he strived hard to spread sweetness and light in this troubled world, and I conclude this with what Shakespeare says in Julius Caesar, squarely applying it to Fr. Gordon:

His life was gentle, and the elements  
So mix'd in him that Nature might stand up  
And say to all the world, 'this was a man!'

Birth Centenary Tribute to Our Principal, Provincial, Jesuit Priest, Our Father and Our Friend, Reverend Douglas Michael Bruce Gordon, S.J. Mr. Chief Guest, Jayaprakash Narayan, Member of the A.P. Legislative Assembly, Founder and CEO of Loksatta Party, Alumni of this great Institution, Doctor, IAS Officer, philosopher, philanthropist, statesman and the very future of our Nation at the Crossroads, Reverend Fathers Rector, Correspondent, Principal, Student and faculty representatives, Jesuit Community of Fathers and Brothers, Faculty members, teaching and non teaching staff, Members of the Alumni and School, Reverend Fathers, Sisters, revered guests, family members of the students and most of all you my dear students of Andhra Loyola College:



Mark the date, the third of February of 1912. On that day a child was born to a Doctor mother and Officer father in British India. The place was The Maternity section of Government Women's Hospital, Egmore, Madras. Many other children may have been born in the same hospital on that day. But It was a day set aside by the Divine for a special child with a special task assigned. This was a child chosen and set apart from others. His parents had no idea or clue of the extraordinary Mission that their child was destined to accomplish. It must have been a glorious day. The entire Hospital Staff and the Army squadron commanded by the proud parent, may have jumped with joy at the arrival of this child. The beauty and serenity of his face, a countenance reflecting the divine that created and nurtured it, must have dazzled those who were there. We can only imagine the celebrations and festivities of that day in that Hospital and at his home.

Barely 12 days after his birth, on the 15<sup>th</sup> of February 1912, this child was Baptized in the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Angles, George Town, Madras, India and was named Douglas Michael Bruce Gordon, to cover the entire Scottish and Irish clans of his ancestors.

The young Douglas was put through the rigors of those days both at school and at home. Much has been written about his early life and also his school and college days. No where can we find any crazy incidents in his formative years or later, that each and every one of us in this imposing auditorium is familiar with or participant of.

One of the oldest images of God's presence is light, a glow, a radiance, a fire. In the Old Testament of the Bible, God's Power and Presence were manifest through a Pillar of Fire, a glowing cloud or the rays from Moses' face. This Radiant Light has long been associated with the Hebrew word "Kabod" which means "Heaviness" or "Importance", and such view of God's radiant, awesome and fiery spirit came into the New Testament of the Bible through



the Greek Word, "Doxa" and rendered into English as "Glory". Many centuries later, St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus grew to love this Word as a sign of God's continuing presence and work in the world. In his Spiritual Exercises he saw "all Good things and Gifts" descending from God as rays descend from the sun, and hence, called on his followers to seek in their actions the "Greater Glory of God, "Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam", in Latin. To Ignatius, "Glory" then meant a manifestation of God's presence through human action and thus this beloved Word "Glory" was chosen as the Motto of his Society. The Essence of This, our young Douglas understood very early in his life to move beyond the human "Realms".

His education at Loyola College, Madras, in the care of the Famous Founding Fathers, the Pioneers of that Magnificent and Enduring Institution, created a Divine Spark within him, which made a trailblazer out of him. This was the Spark that ignited his Zeal in the form of Vocation, the Divine Call, that, led him to the Jesuits' way of life. His decision to join the Jesuits must have been a terrible shock to his folks and we can easily assume, a great and most painful disappointment to many a young and beautiful woman of his day. Well, on his Birth Centenary day, we can say this and have some fun too.

Let us fast forward to June 1945. This is a landmark date for young Scholastic Gordon. He was ordained a Jesuit Priest on 23rd march 1945. A twelve-year saga of soul-searching spiritual training, rigorous intellectual pursuits filled with challenges in a young body, heart, soul and mind. He survived all of it and more only known to him alone. He was a child destined from birth for God's Business. This was a great task he endured it beyond endurance and entered into the higher realms and beyond human dreams and aspirations.

Human words will fail and may fall short of, the hand of an artist will never be able to capture the halo effect of Douglas and the sculptor will need to go back a thousand times to his studio to reshape, remold and to recast, to bring Douglas's face into Focus. No matter what we say or not say now, will ever come close to the live portrait of this great Human being, Jesuit Priest, Mentor to many of us, friend to all of us and today a grandpa to the "Millennials" that is, all of you, who were born in the recent past. He himself was a self made artist. His own hands have brought many paintings of landscape and portraits of Jesuit Saints to life, adorning the walls of some of the Jesuit Institutions, even to this day. As a budding poet, he brought Mother Nature to life and reality. His religious lines inspiring many and his random subjects connecting those far and near, made Douglas a Saint in a hurry. He was truly a Holy Man, a scholar and a gentleman. He knew his Olympic Motto, "Citius, Altius, Fortius" that is "Swifter, Higher, Stronger" besides, his Society's "Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam" to its fullest effect. He lived it all, so be it.

The year 1953 brings to the Telugu People of this area two sacred gifts in the name of two Great Jesuits. One of them, is the Founding Father of Andhra Loyola College the Saintly Father Devaiah Karnam. He was noble by birth, ran away from an ICS officer education in London and a Promising Career in India. His simple living and high thinking to become a Jesuit for all, earned us the ground that we stand on today and the Imposing Hall that we are seated in. The other Great Jesuit is a Tall, towering, brimming with smiles, shining his inner





trailblazer spirit, mesmerizing those who fell under his shadow, totally clueless himself, arriving in a place where he had no idea of the people, their looks, language, traditions and customs and faced with an Institution in its inception with no proper infrastructure and almost zero personnel to run, was Fr. Douglas Michael Bruce Gordon. Here we meet him for the first time. Here, the young Jesuit Priest falls in love with our Telugu Thalli. His Romance with our sacred ground and his devotion to our Telugu Matha is legendary and only those who knew him from within, can proclaim his solemn dedication, commitment, loyalty, service for the people and only for others, in the spirit of his Founding Father, St. Ignatius, for the "Greater Glory of God", Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam.

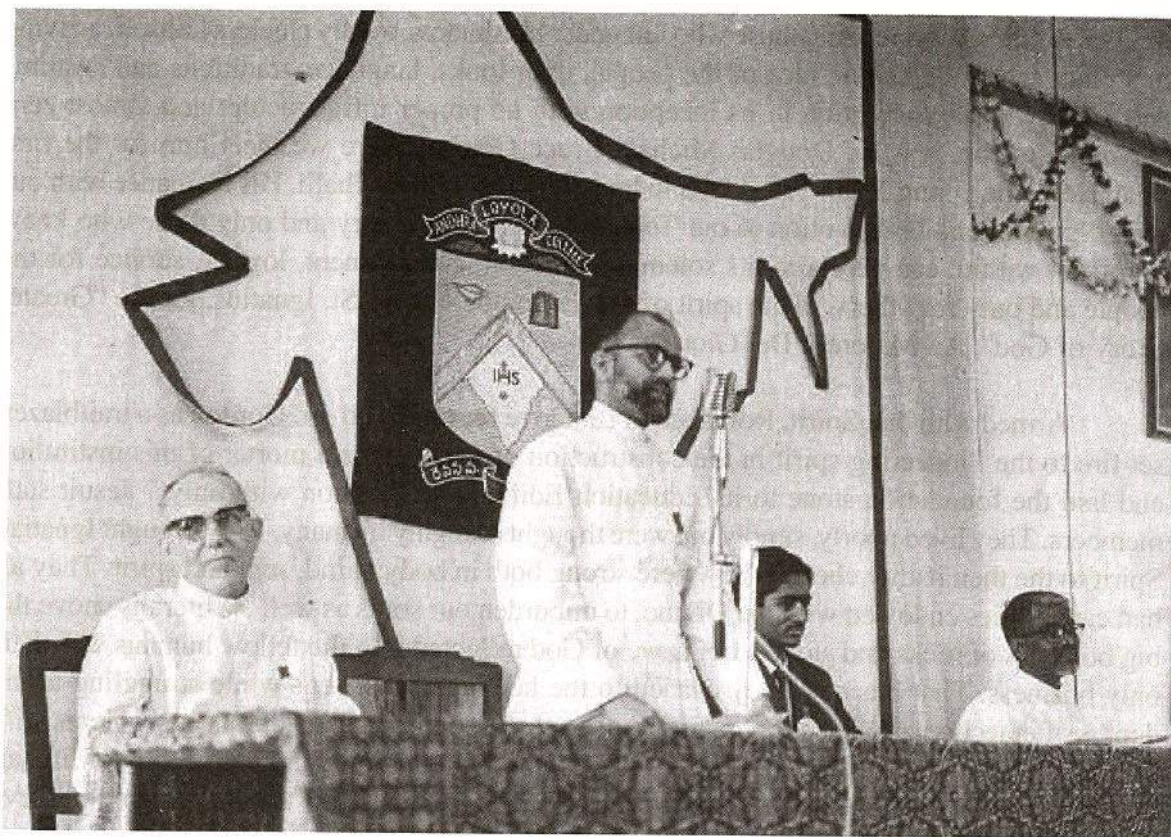
Armed with that Spirit, Romance or first love for our Land, Fr. Gordon as a trailblazer, set fire to the Pioneering spirit in the construction of the brick and mortar of this institution and laid the foundation stone to its Education Edifice and tradition with only 7 Jesuit staff members. They lived poorly, simply but were thought of highly by many. They brought Ignatian Spirit to the then reality check. They were strong both in body, mind, soul and spirit. They all had capabilities endowed with the Divine, to unburden our souls as well as literally move the big boulders of rocks and stones too. Love of God reflected into the fellow humans was their only business. That business they carried to the heights of heavens while struggling at the depths of dejection and rejection, facing challenges beyond human endurance, problems with no solutions in sight, hope against hope and with undoubting faith and philosophy of life, all that summarized in these three Latin Words, "Ministrare non Ministrari", "I came to serve and not to be served". Fr. Gordon was their leader, their servant, their inspiration and the one who carried it all for them and for us in the two of his strong and yet beautiful hands. He had the dreams and he had the vision of those dreams to reach the end goals, in the face of untold problems and failures that our Pioneers faced. The heat of Summer of Gunadala, the heat waves of the blazing sun that even the natives feared did not deter our Young Fr. Gordon from his resolute Romance with his Sacred ground that we tread on today. His boundless love, devotion, loyalty and commitment to our Telugu Thalli and her people grew day by day as time ticked on.

Two times Provincial Superior of a Large Madurai Province that is a rare responsibility thrust on our Fr. Gordon by the Black Pope, they call Father General of the Jesuits in Rome, that may have taken a toll on our beloved Principal then Provincial. Those grueling travels from Vindhya Mountains to Cape Comerin, the Southern tip of India several times a year with a travel schedule that took him away 75% of his time. The vagaries of weather, mode of transportation by Bus, car, train and even walking where others would not dare to, for his only business, that is, you and I and our welfare, surely have done early damage to his health.

He set many hearts and souls on fire. He built many institutions. He devised several innovative projects, he created ideas that were out of box thinking, he divided the Province to create a new one that we call Andhra today, he took a road least traveled by to strike the deals for his God's Business and he did many unthinkable in a positive sense, to bring peace, love, sunshine and above all harmony.







He spoke many languages. He was a brilliant student, teacher and connecting counselor to all levels of thinking. He took the rejected bricks from the education buildings and made them the corner stones of the present edifices around the Globe. His love for the poor is the basis of his Jesuit and Education career. You may only know of him as a Towering Jesuit Priest with European looks debating, discussing the issues of higher learning and with simple thinking, moving about the college and University Syndicate portals bringing innovative ideas and changes to create a University based on the ideals set in the Book by Cardinal Neuman "The idea of a University" which we must all read some day. His real mind set was on poor brothers and sisters of ours on earth. His admission process was not based on the genes, generosity of purse, intellectual capabilities, political pressures. He admitted many a poor who could not even dream of entering the gates of this great institution. He went on silently supporting many poor students with the money he received from his siblings who were wealthy. His passion was for the weak, lowly and humble. He championed the causes of those whom we hardly have seen let alone have either met or counted.

God created him like He did, all of us. He gave him the freedom that we all got too. But Fr. Gordon took that Freedom a few notches higher than most humans and stood his ground, ran his race, kept his faith, kindled other peoples hope, stole many hearts and souls, showed the real meaning of "burning heart concept" to complete the race that took him up the cliffs and down the valleys, through the highways and byways, to the highly placed people and to the lowly and to the palaces and into the huts. He also knew his responsibilities for his community of Jesuits and to the folks that were assigned to him.



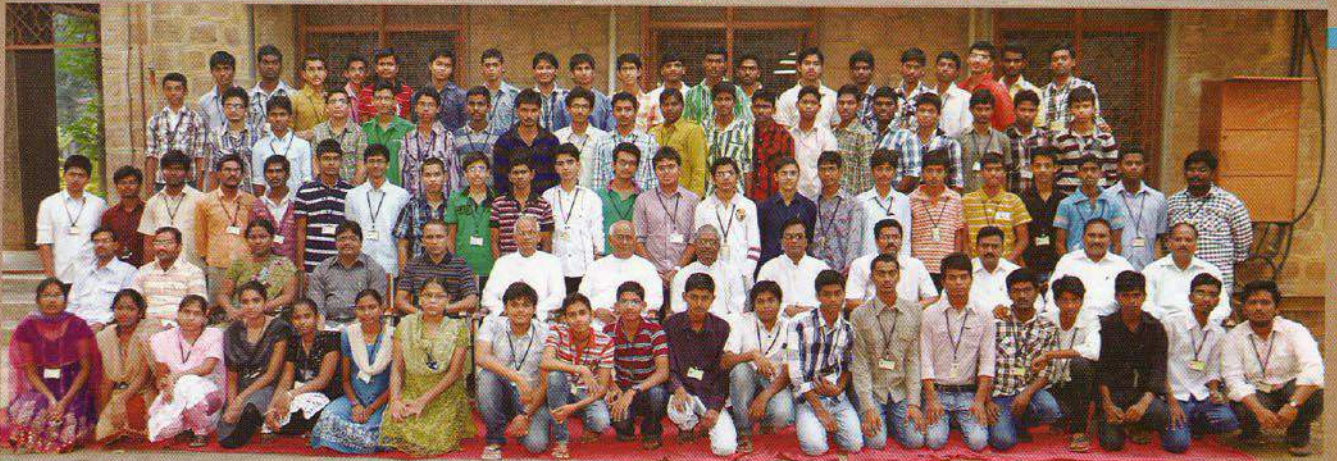

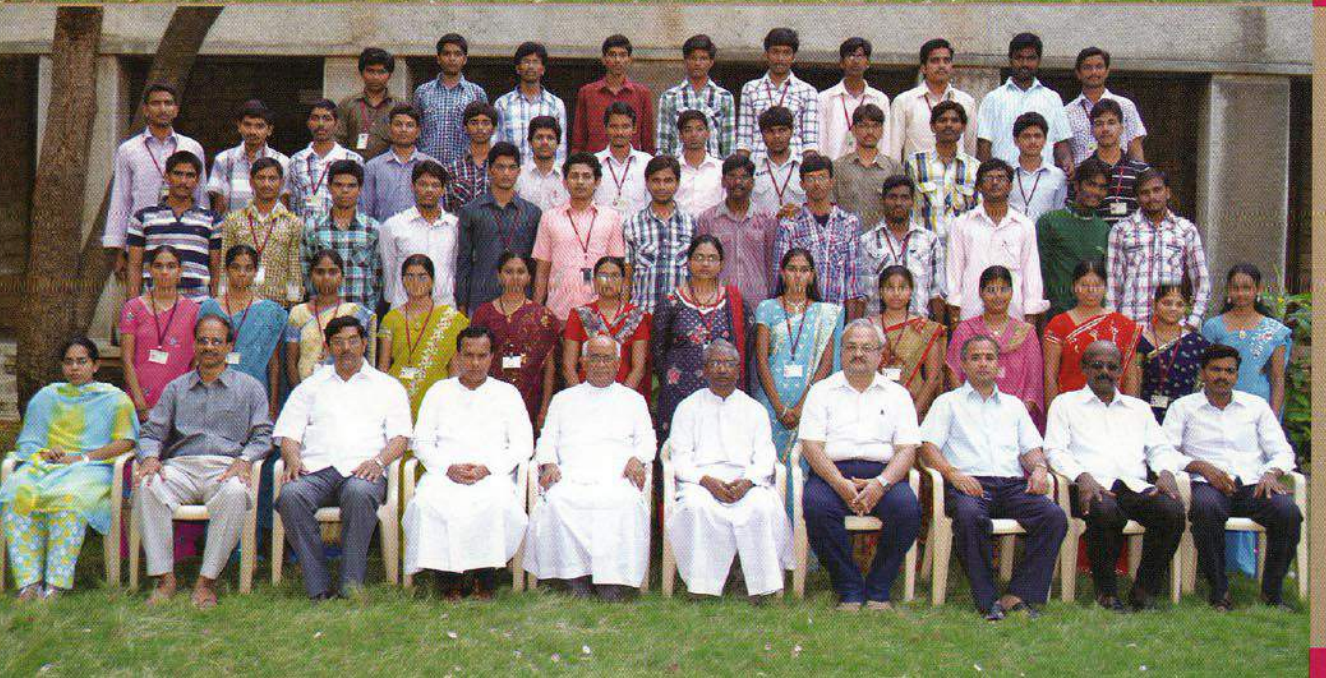

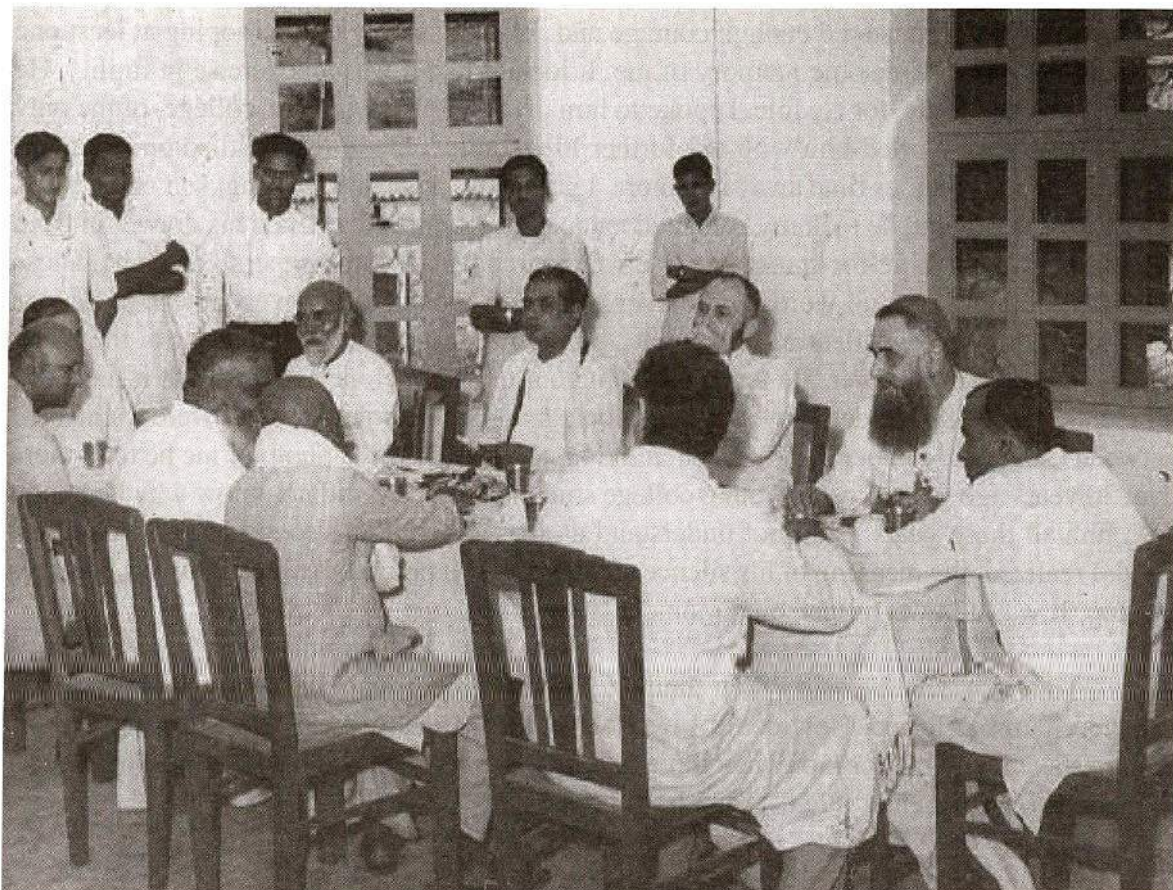

MATRIMONY

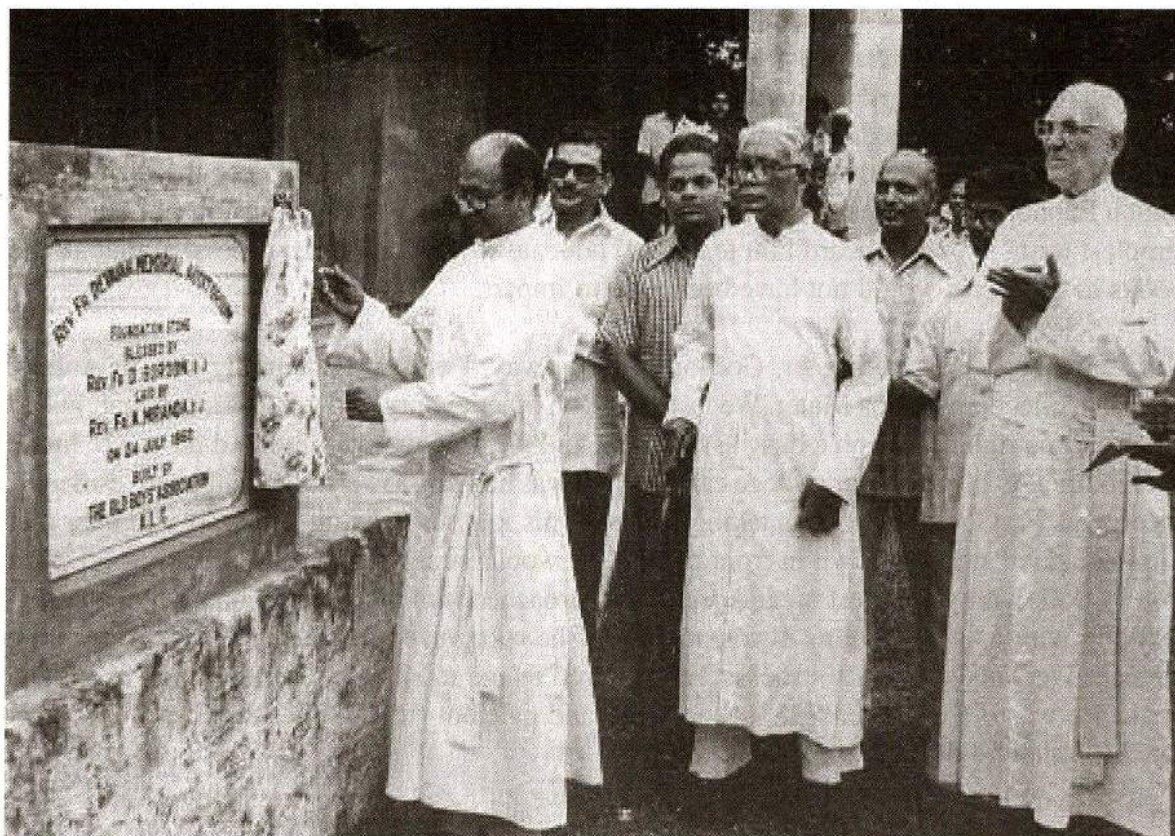


He was a professor of economics and French. He was a professor of religious education and moral education. He could reach the top intellectuals in many a field and debate the most controversial subjects, use his logic, language skills and dissect the impossible. As a professor of Economics he reached out to the least of his class knowing fully well how ill equipped, most of us had come here with poor English Language skills. His vision of the then closed Indian Economy, would have unfolded to them today's "interconnected fusion economics" in simplest terms. To have heard him teach and educate would have been a Lesson, that all the books in the world would not have been able to impart.

A few weeks before Fr. Gordon passed away, I was providentially led to Andhra Loyola College, my Alma Mater. We last met each other twenty two years prior to that, just to set the scene right. I was on a busy assignment and the time was very limited for me in India, at that time. As I entered our college campus and was heading towards the Father's Residence, there, was Fr. Gordon who was taking some of his famous evening walks. If you ever met him and stood stooped down in front of him, he would straighten you up literally, and warn you to walk with your chest up and proud. I approached him and greeted him but he kept on walking with a smile on him. I was not sure if he recognized me or not. There was a long silence. We walked up to his room. He gestured to me to sit at his table. He sat in his old chair. He was old and tired. He looked weak and pale but firm in his chair. He did not talk much. Initially, I did not know what to say.







Somehow I mustered enough courage and kept on talking to him hoping at least one incident may bring him some memory of me. It looked like it was an exercise in futility. He would just listen to me for a while. I spoke to him of my early days in the college, of the only year I spent here. I filled him with my further life, studies, life abroad and so on. I did not want to take his precious time away any more. I got up to wish him, so long, so I could be on my way. At that point, he took my hand and made me sit again. He opened his drawer in front of him. He was looking for something. He was searching for some papers I thought. Those were the moments that no words could ever express. I looked at him very intently. He was frail but healthy. A few silent moments later he found what he was looking for in the many papers he had in the drawer. He took something out of an envelope and stared at it for a few moments and finally handed it over to me to look at it. All this time no words were exchanged between us. I could not believe it myself at the first glance. It was a photo of me he took more than 30 years ago when I was a young college student like you. I did not know why he kept it with him all these years. I did not understand at all. My emotions took better of me. I just cried. I realized the meaning of his silence all along at that point. I saw a tear fall off from his eye too. It was a powerful personal moment for me.

This was what he said. "You thought I had forgotten you. All that you were saying was very familiar to me. How could I ever forget you. I just wanted you to know that this picture stayed with me for more than three decades for a reason. You had to come and we had to meet. It is Providential Plan". Then he smiled.



Time has moved on for both of us. But “for those who truly Love Time is Eternal”. We talked much of what was, what could have been, what may be in store for each of us and so on. Both of us were emotionally charged as we both knew at that moment that may be our last look at each other. There are many things happen to us in our lives but there is always one incident that we just cherish and can never explain. This was mine and there are no words for me to say further. He blessed me with a fond good bye. I said so long dear Father and left him with a premonition that we would never meet each other again in this life. Our last hand shake and our last look at each other was a moment that we both knew would be the very last. He for his Eternal Rest well deserved and me for self discovery yet to happen went our separate ways. This is the moment I wanted to share with you on this day. Barely a month after I went back to USA, I wrote a touching and moving letter to him. A few weeks later, I got a reply. It was not from Fr. Gordon but from Fr. Rector, to tell me that I was three days late and Father passed away peacefully and with a smile on his face. I choked reading it and I choke even now thinking about it. He was a real Saint that the Vatican will never be able to find to Canonize. On this day, we the people of Telugu Thalli and Bharatamatha will raise him to the realms beyond Sainthood.



Well, I can go on and on but the time is running out on me. Fr. Gordon is telling me that you have spoken enough of me and for me. He is also warning me to leave gracefully as the attention span of any audience in the world is less than a few minutes.

To pay a tribute to such Scholar, Saint, Priest, Friend and a real gentleman one needs to silently think of him and embed his philosophy of life into ones own and to count the blessings of the Divine for having sent him to us, to the people of Telugu Speaking everywhere. How blessed were his parents, his siblings and family!

Fr. Gordon is very much with us now. On his Centenary Birth Anniversary here are his words for us all.

Dear God, Bless these young men and women as they go forth to serve YOU and their brothers and sisters everywhere in the world. Bless their families and friends, who have sacrificed so much to support and encourage them in their pursuit of education of heart, soul and mind in this beautiful Loyola Campus. Bless their teaching and non teaching staff to continue to instruct and inspire the young men and women to seek the Truth and then embrace all that is good. Bless the Alumni of this great Institution which nurtured and loved them all and empowered them with Ignatian, Jesuit Liberal Education, over six decades. Finally, bless all those who are here in this imposing and inspiring auditorium built in the memory of my dear friend, Fr. Karnam Devaiah, so that all we think, say or do might be always for “Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam” “For the Greater Glory of God”

Thank you all and so long and May Fr. Gordon go with us, walk with us, live with us and cry with us, laugh with us. Let us all look up, stand up and clap for Fr. Gordon so he can hear us proudly, mightily and loudly.





## Rev. Fr. GORDON - A TOUCH OF VINTAGE

Is Rev. Fr. Gordon a person or an institution or a 'phenomenon'? This is a very difficult question to answer. He is perhaps all the above rolled into one. When I think of him, my thoughts go back to the early 60s of the last century and an all pervading sense of nostalgia caresses my body like the fragrance of spring. Well, there can never be a disagreement on the historic role of Rev. Fr. Gordon in laying the foundation to this great college. He was an academician, an administrator *par excellence* and an outstanding Principal, who brought ALC into limelight those early days. His stint as a Member of the Syndicate of the Andhra University will be etched in *gilt letters* into the annals of the history of ALC. His tall stature, effective communication, broad outlook on issues concerning education and his academic vision made him virtually the focus of attention in the meetings of the Syndicate of AU and won him many admirers those days. Many of his suggestions used to be implemented as many Syndicate Members used to look forward to being benefited by his academic acumen and his guidance. In whatever he did, there was a '*touch of vintage*' and a '*tinge of excellence*'.

I had the wonderful opportunity of observing him at close quarters whenever he attended the Syndicate Meetings, as I was doing my post graduate studies in the Andhra University during the years **1961-1963**. Those were the days when the *alumni* of ALC stood TALL in the student circles of AU, as we always identified ourselves as the students of ALC under the principalship of Rev. Fr. Gordon. I used to see him off at Waltair station after his meetings in the AU Administrative office, and I always felt it a rare honour. He knew me so well as the Leader of my class for two successive years (B.Sc. 1959-60 and 60-61), a participant in cultural activities and above all as the **Gold Medallist** of my class in **1961**. When I met him for a testimonial (if memory does not fail, I was perhaps the only person from my class who could get a testimonial worth treasuring for a life time from him), he described me as a **young man of many parts**, the real meaning of which I did not understand until I unfolded myself so in my career.

When I came to see him after completing my Masters' at the AU, I never dreamt that he would make a spontaneous offer to me - **a place in the Zoology Faculty**. Teaching at that tender age of 19 years and 7 months to be more precise, I am sure, I lived up to his confidence in me - which reminds me how accurate he was in judging my capabilities and potential. He shielded me from '*human jealousy*' and '*sub-human culture*' of a colleague which pushed me to the extent of trying for a job elsewhere. When I was offered the post of the Head of the Department in **Ramachandrapuram** (E. Godavari), with an eventual chance of becoming



the Principal, two of my God Fathers dissuaded me – one being Rev. Fr. Gordon himself . I am happy he did it, for, but for ALC, I wouldn't have been what I am today.

Rev. Fr. Gordon used to be highly *organised* and a very *calculated* person, perhaps subtly reflecting his Scottish roots. When I wrote to him to send my **Gold Medal** to my University address by registered post, he wrote to me back that I should send him one **rupee** to cover the postal charges. As I also happen to be an equally 'calculated' person , though not as organised , I did not appreciate his letter as the charge for registered post those days was **paise seventy five** only. However, I yielded, as the Gold Medal was pretty dear to me.

On many an occasion I had the opportunity of working with him, especially in the activities of the Old Boys' Association. When I was given the responsibility of bringing out the OBA News Letter, I was immensely benefited by his suggestions regarding using appropriate words at places where I did not use the right words. When Sri V. V. Krishna Rao garu, as the Principal of a college in Chilakaluripet , sought my help in procuring the biodata and a photograph of Rev.Fr.Gordon, it took a while before I could make him agree and having observed my tenacity , he called me an *incorrigible optimist*. On another occasion he dubbed me a '*maverick*', which indeed, I am. I used to be at his beck and call for any work requiring stay of additional hours on the campus and my association with him added a new dimension to my personality and changed my perspective of life and work .

He was always straight and frank and he would never go for *sugar coated pills* when he had something not so pleasant, to share with the staff, in his meetings. I never saw him mincing words.

Coming to another aspect of the reverend, I always admired the patient way he affixed his characteristic signature on documents, which I tried to emulate in creating my own style of signature. And, he once watched me sign on a paper and asked if my signature was English!

If I were to write an *epitaph* on his tomb, I guess, I would write - '*Earth has lost an Academic Visionary, but Heaven surely gained an Angel*'. I am soon going to enter my 50<sup>th</sup> year of teaching Biology /Zoology and , if and when I complete it , I am sure it is sort of *personal record* to me and Rev. Fr. Gordon will certainly be happy watching me and my record from his FINAL ABODE for , it was he who SELECTED me at ALC.





## Homage to Fr Gordon

This is possible thanks to the well laid down policy of recruitment of Fr Gordon. Those who were privileged to work at Loyola, never heard of selection on the lines of caste or creed in spite of the college being a Christian minority institution. One notable feature of his policy of recruitment was to accord preference to the old students and his sense of judgment was said to be so high that he used to take only a couple of minutes in selecting them to the teaching positions.

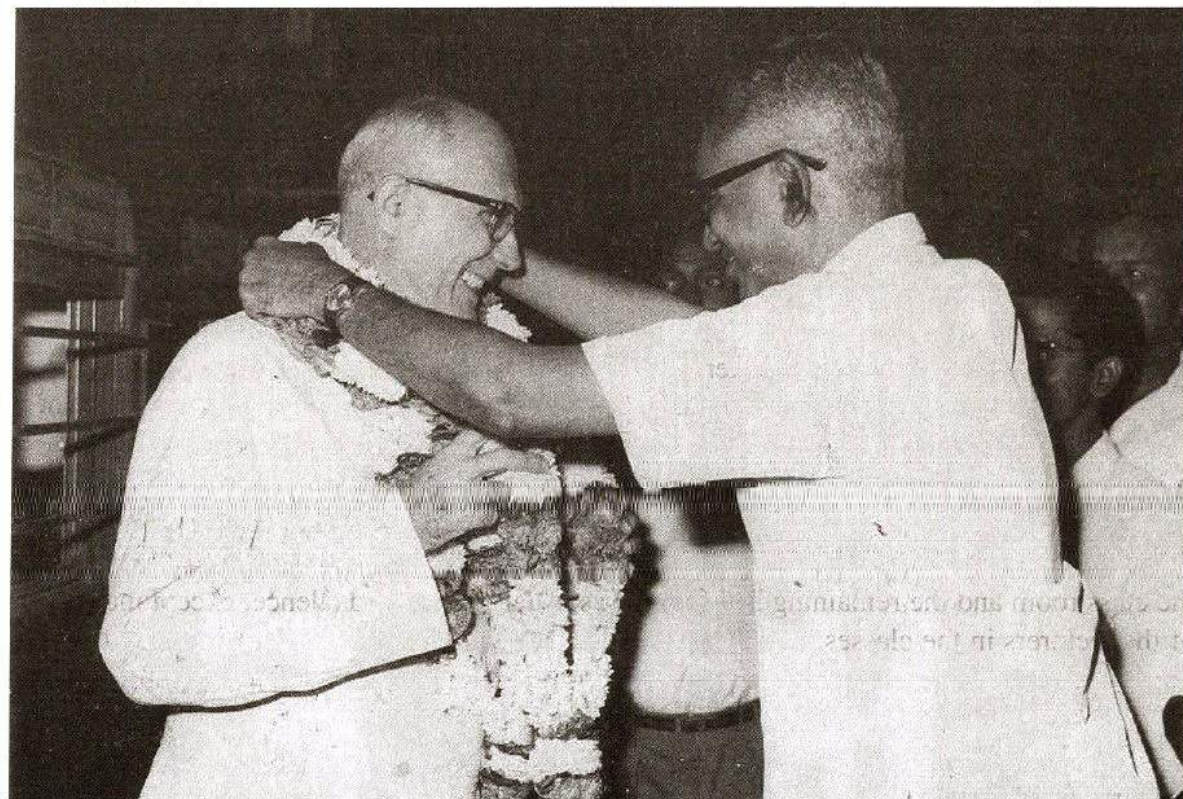
The degree of respect and honour that he wielded from the students, the staff and the general public was unparalleled. Particularly the student community adored him and his towering personality was always a source of inspiration to them. Large number of those admitted by him could easily sneak into medical, engineering and higher civil services in all parts of India as well as the world. In terms of discipline, his very physical personality, pleasing and inspiring appearance dictated terms to others. I was a witness to an incident in 1968 when the students gathered at the vacant place right in front of the college in order to launch an agitation. But, the moment the first bell rang, the towering personality came out of his chamber and with a smiling face, waved his hand towards the unrest students asking them non-verbally to go to their respective class rooms. In just about a minute, not even one student was outside the class room and the remaining things were as usual - graveyard silence, except the voices of the lecturers in the classes.



One must see his extraordinary skills in trouble shooting situations. During 1980-81, he was the rector of the college when there was large scale student unrest on the campus. He could face any tense situation with ease. I saw him physically pushing out a band of trouble makers in front of the new hostel and thus restoring order there. He never tolerated indiscipline on the campus. I remember that he even threatened the students that he would recommend for the permanent closure of the college if indiscipline persisted.

Fr Gordon was known for exceptional clarity of thought; he was very precise in using words. The one outstanding feature of his administration was the lack of infirmity in the decision-making process. In the academic circles, he was always a role model and at the university level, his opinion on all important matters had special bearing on the final outcome. He set a bench-mark in the teaching-learning process.

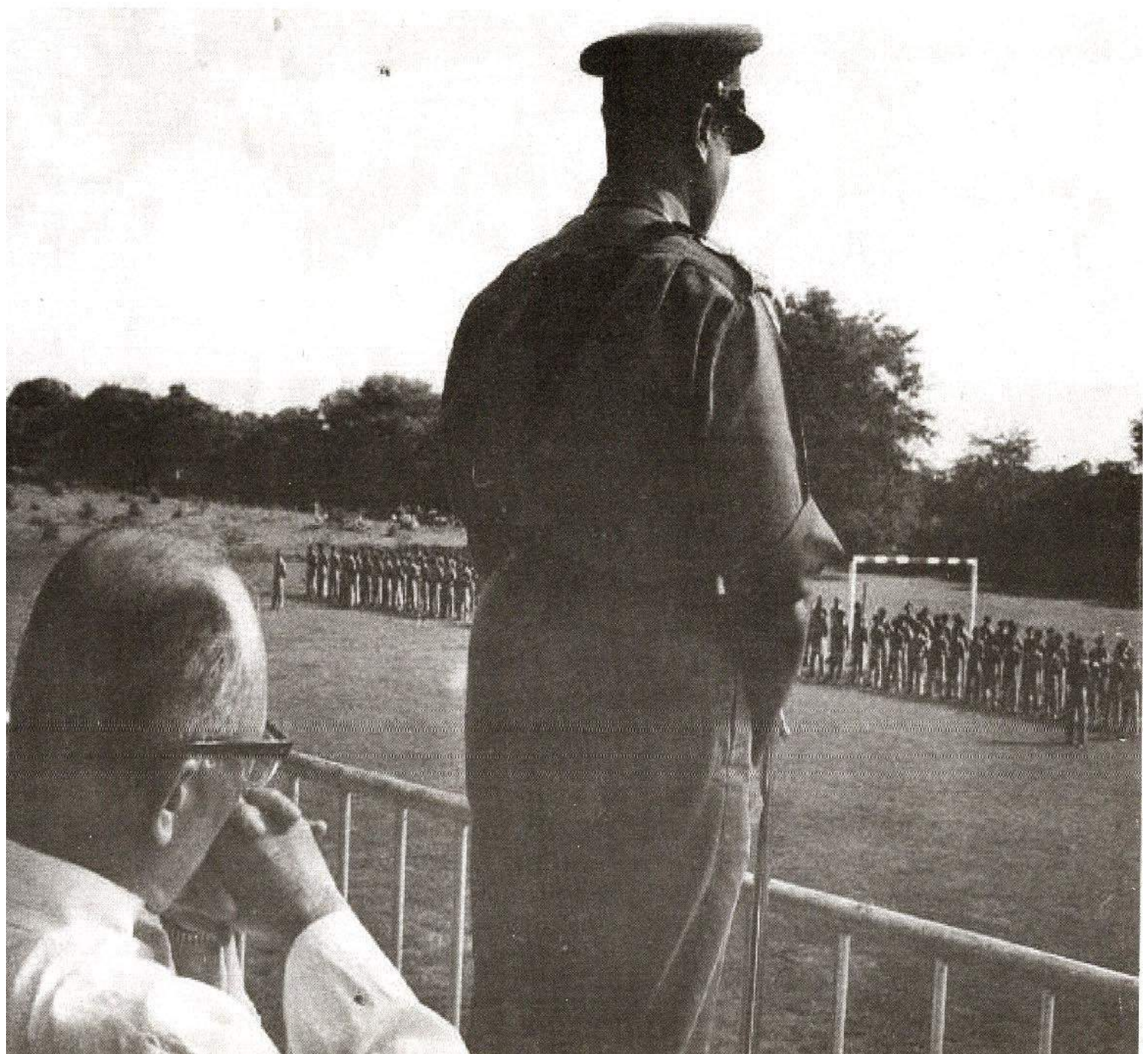

## WHY THIS 'KOLA VERI'?

Why are these things happening? Why don't they understand my feelings? Why have I to come to college and study about all these useless things? Why have I to struggle for assignments and practical exams? Why this 'Kola Veri' (killing Anger)?

These are the questions which arise in the minds of most of our youngsters. We are living in a busy world and technology made us communicate where ever we want. We are in 'Kola veri' (Hyper tension) era that we want to do everything the way we want. A Lady teacher working in a private school in Tamil Nadu was brutally killed by her ninth standard student this February 2012. It created a sensation in the educational sectors. He did this to his teacher just because she told him that she would take his irregularity to the notice of his parents and the management. This raises lots of questions. Why this 'Kola Veri'? Where we are leading our youngsters to? What is happening to this young world?

Now a days, youngsters know everything even if they do not have experience. Social networks and the new media have given access to everything to the urban youngsters. A host of surveys is figuring out what it means to be a teenager: they pack in 38 hours of activities into a day's work, chat, browse, talk, SMS, Twitter, Facebook, smoke, drink, splurge, take drugs, have sex, get pregnant -and they can't wait for their future to arrive. This is the case with the metropolitan cities in India. I know that a city like Vijayawada is not much into this trouble. But I can assure that our city is very close to these issues. If every generation needs a cultural marker, Facebook is the canvas on which the digitally lively teens spill their secrets. Now they need no canteen to share gossips. Many of the teens spend nearly 45 minute a day on Facebook.

Moreover, according to UGC, students and colleges in India indicate a healthy growth in terms of institutional capacity. Between 2004 and 2009, the number of colleges increased by nearly 9,000 and the student enrolment increased by 3.65 million students. I feel there would be much more increment, statistically, from 2010 to 2011. But now the problem is whether colleges are getting motivated students are not. Because, due to the digital divide, some students, who have access to the internet, are getting all kinds of information which makes them turn off their studies. Students who don't have internet knowledge don't know how to get the information and they are struggling in their studies. Ironically, this widening of gap created by the digital era made the students go mad and they don't know what to do.







Thus our students are being misled by a number of factors:

1. Lack of parental guidance
2. Negligence of the lecturers
3. Misleading media
4. Wrong friendship

If the two groups of people mentioned above do their duty properly, automatically, the next two factors of our children will be regulated. So, the discipline of our children is still there in our hands. I always wonder why a few parents don't admit their children into a college. Even I have observed some students who came for admission along with their friends.

Pocket money is playing a major role in distracting a student from studies. As far as my knowledge goes, if a student is mischievous, his parents are to be blamed. Because, they are the first people who should notice their behaviour. But many parents provide so much of pocket money to their children leading to bad behavioural changes. Parents should spend enough time with their children and they have to share and guide them with all their experience

and wisdom. But the present system of family has failed in doing so.

What we understand from this is that the relationship between students and lecturers is not good. A lecturer can easily identify the behavioural changes and he/she has the power to change things. But now it's a big question. If a lecturer complains about certain issues regarding a student, the parents do not support the lecturer. Instead they support their children. When I spoke to a senior lecturer about these problems, she too accepted what I said and she expressed that in olden days students had respect for their lecturers and now it has disappeared. If a student is from a wealthy background, he/she thinks that lecturers teach to earn their bread. It is also felt that lecturers do not have any right to regulate students. But in the past, parents themselves used to request lecturers to regulate their children. I don't know what has triggered this change.

In *media dependency theory*, it is stated that the more dependent an individual is on the media for having his or her needs fulfilled, the more important the media will be to that person. So, now, these misleading media and their content are causing a lot of distraction among students. In fact, we have to accept that our students do not have analysing skills to identify the good and the bad in the media content. So the excessive intake of media content leads to hyperactiveness. So it's our duty as teachers to guide them in a proper way and we have





to transfer their negative stress in to positive stress.

Researchers say that positive stress is good for life which improves happiness and provides with achievement for everyone. Negative stress (also called Distress) is the stress that makes a person feel diffident. If the students have been feeling this stress for a long time their body will wear out and they will not be able to function normally. This can lead to depression, anxiety, lower self esteem and other mental health issues. Positive stress is called *Eustress* and it is a normal part of our everyday life. This type of stress positively affects us and keeps us going. It has a motivational effect and increases our activity and productivity. *Eustress* is essential for our success and has to be praised.

So to overcome distress we should be engaged in regular exercise, stretching, controlled breathing (Pranayama), humor (funny movies, jokes, pranks, ...), stress relief games, socializing (being with other people can help greatly when we are trying to reduce the stress), meditation, yoga, proper

nutrition. Time management skills are also often vital to our success for a graduate student. Learning these skills offers planning and organizational strategies and explores ways to increase motivation and productivity. So a good student should increase this skill with the help of faculty members, and lecturers should teach them discipline by setting deadlines for their assignments and practical exams.

Discipline means guiding our students into the best course of life and it is down out of love, not anger or frustration. Here audiences are the news disseminators who always stay active to the contemporary issues their and amicable solutions as well in the society.

### Future of Citizen Journalism and Journalists:

The boundary and future of citizen journalism is increasing spree as new media is enhancing its wings. In common sense, it is seen that as long as there is a means of distribution, there will be a place of citizen journalism. Needless to say, it is impossible for the news media to cover every single community in-depth, so it is scope and responsibility as well for the citizens to bridge the gaps. However to many, the loopholes in the citizen journalism can be minimized with the collective intervention from Press Council of India, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and media houses in a judicious mode, keeping the goals and spirits of such kind of journalism intact.





# Hostile and Toxic Work Environment: Breeding Role of Gossiping and Backbiting

The term work environment can apply to nearly any location or setting where there are people doing things. A person in an office, someone doing dishes at home and someone hunting an animal for dinner are all working and are all in an environment. Even though all these locations and actions could be work environments, typically only the first one would be considered as such.

A work environment is often described as good or bad. A good environment is a place where the workers feel at ease and appreciated. Workers in these sorts of environments are often more productive and happy. A bad work environment is a location where the worker feels under-appreciated, threatened or unsettled. Due to the nature of these environments, there is often a high worker turnover rate, and the workers typically fail to live up to their potential. A bad work environment is often referred to as *hostile work environment*.

A hostile work environment describes a workplace situation where an employee cannot reasonably perform his work, due to certain behaviors by management or co-workers that are deemed hostile. Hostility in this form is not only a boss being rude, yelling, or annoying. It is very specific, especially when the workplace relationship problems arise for creating an environment that causes severe stress to the employees.

There's just a handful of ways in which one can define hostile work environment. Any act or remarks that are overtly discriminatory regarding age, race, gender, sexual orientation, or disability are also considered to create a hostile work environment. Any act of sexual harassment on the part of bosses or co-workers can be viewed as hostile.

## Gossiping and Backbiting

Gossip is defined as a mischievous or an idle talk about the affairs of others. It is usually degrading and belittling, and always unnecessary. Backbiting is speaking ill of someone and making a verbal attack on others behind their backs when they're not around to defend themselves. It is somehow similar to gossip but it is more malicious, insidious and evidently with evil intent—to destroy the reputation of the other person.

Studies reveal that, in most instances, gossips and backbiting are driven by jealousy of the person backbiting towards the person who is the topic of the gossip. Jealousy is resentment, hostility or envy toward someone usually because of his perceived advantages,





e.g., better job performance, a happier family life, more popular, better looking, fairer skin, taller...anything at all that can be perceived as an advantage.

Well, as unpleasant as these topics are, the facts are, many of us work in environments where these three things are common occurrences. Employees in various organizations, irrespective of size and nature, complain about their **hostile work environment**. And, yes, some of them have had pretty bad work environments. They claim bad bosses, dysfunctional, gossiping and backbiting coworkers, and management decisions they abhor. Back-stabbing colleagues are common at workplaces of all kinds of human organizations. Most of us have been the subject of gossip and backbiting at some point in our lives, and we've all felt the sting of humiliation that goes along with it. On the other hand, we've all done some gossiping and backbiting of our own, and we may have hurt someone else's feelings as a result.

Usually, the "charges" are twisted out of context or fabricated or at the very least, overstated to make the negative impact more devastating. As we all work in different kinds of organizations composed of people, it is important to somehow understand why people are the way they are. It's been proven, for example, that the main reason people backbite is that they feel very insecure about themselves. They need someone to blame for their problems. And this is a destructive way they try to make themselves look or feel better. It has been said that in the lips of slanderers and backbiters there is as a fire, to brand his neighbor's reputation. A froward man, that cannot find in his heart to love anybody but himself, is vexed to see others live in love, and therefore makes it his business to sow strife, by telling lies, and carrying ill-natured stories between friends so as to separate them one from another.

One day an acquaintance met Socrates, the great Greek Philosopher who was reputed to hold knowledge in high esteem, and said, "Do you know what I just heard about your friend?"

"Hold on a minute," Socrates replied. "Before telling me anything I'd like you to pass a little test. It's called the Triple Filter Test."

"Triple filter?"

"That's right," Socrates continued. "Before you talk to me about my friend, it might be a good idea to take a moment and filter what you're going to say. That's why I call it the triple filter test. The first filter is Truth. Have you made absolutely sure that what you are about to tell me is true?"

"No," the man said, "actually I just heard about it and."

"All right," said Socrates. "So you don't really know if it's true or not. Now let's try the second filter, the filter of goodness. Is what you are about to tell me about my friend something good?"

**nor good nor even useful**, why tell it to me at all?"

Some people are guilty of speaking too swiftly when they really need to wait before saying anything. The Holy Scriptures says in Proverbs 18:13: "He that answers a matter before he hears it, it is folly and shame unto him." How many times have you had to "eat" your words because you spoke too swiftly? James 1:19 warns us to be swift to HEAR and SLOW to speak. Why do you suppose God gave us two ears but only one mouth?

Toxic work environment can be a result of too much office politics, bad bosses and many more factors. If you feel I hate my boss or I hate my job, there may be some valid reasons behind your feelings. Followings are some of the major reasons that make an office or work environment extremely toxic, hostile, unhealthy or unbearable to work with-



#### Ø **Too much office Politics:**

If the corporate culture is such that encourages secret handshake, grouping, teaming up etc. and the career advancement depends on whose team you are in rather than your contribution; it is definitely a frustrating work environment and your office is definitely a toxic work environment!

#### Ø **Bad bosses:**

Non- caring, abusive, bullying, too demanding and in general mean bosses come under this category. If you happen to have one of them, you have very validated reasons to feel "I hate my Boss!!" and you are definitely in an unhealthy toxic work environment.

#### Ø **Evil co-worker:**

Mean, back-biting, back stabbing, want to go up at any cost! - sound familiar? Every workplace has them. They are like human poison - even the presence of one or two of this type can make the entire office very toxic work environment.

#### Ø **Extreme or unrealistic work load:**

Corporate world is all about profit and the maximum they can squeeze out of an individual definitely contribute to that profit. But when the demands from the employer or the management become unrealistic or extreme it is time for you to protect your physical as well as mental well being from this toxic office!

#### Ø **Employee has no access to personal data (over-confidentiality):**

Can't view, can't update personal information; has no access to his/ her Leave records, salary data, and attendance record, training & promotion details. Not sure if the management's decisions are based on correct information. This breeds suspicion since there is a perceived lack of transparency. Impact is on employee-employer relationships.



### Ø **Lack of appreciation and feed back:**

Sometimes all we need is a small word of thanks or a little appreciation to make us go through a demanding or tedious job and unfortunately many of us work in such an environment where appreciation for a job well done does not even exist. Worse is when you don't even know how you are doing as there is hardly any communication or feed back! If these are the situation your frustration and feelings of "I hate my job" is well justified!

### Ø **Routine, dull, non-challenging work assignment:**

It depends on individual's personality and type of aptitude for different type of work. If the existing works don't interest you any more or worse make you feel bored it's time to move on.

### Ø **Lack of clarity on Deliverables**

Absence of a well-defined job-description leads to lack of accountability. Neither the employee nor his / her immediate superior (boss) are able to define the job-deliverables. Result is the loss of focus & interest.

### Ø **Absence of Goal-based performance**

Employee is unaware of the goals to be achieved during the year. There are no targets and no process to track their completion. The organization carries out merely an end of the year postmortem of an employee's performance. The unaccomplished tasks go unnoticed. It becomes very difficult to build a performance culture in such organizations.

### Ø **Employee development without his/ her involvement**

No opportunity is given to an employee to project his /her development needs. There is no formal process to collect training needs and do gap analysis of skills & competencies. All this leads to unplanned employee development, a wasteful effort, both in time & the dollars spent on training.

### Ø **Rusting of Talent**

Long tenures in the same position with no avenues for job rotations make people rust & relax. In the first 2-3 years in a job position an employee experiences new challenges, innovates & contributes. Thereafter the routine takes over. Even a change of location, if not the job, can provide the requisite challenge to an employee. This is enough to remove the rust and make the talent bloom again.

### Ø **Non-performers lobby**

Each non-performer remains glued to his/ her chair. The worst happens when a non-performing manager has to appraise subordinates who are professionally competent, high-energy youngsters. Some of them leave the organization prematurely and add to the attrition rate. The end result is the building of a non-performers lobby which impedes the progress of the organization. It is a vicious cycle which can be stopped only by filtering out the non-performers.

### Ø **Absence of schemes to retain performers**

Getting rid of the non-performers is important, but to be able to identify, develop & retain high performers is equally vital. If your best talent is being lured by other companies, your schemes to reward performance are simply inadequate.





### Ø **Shyness to obtain Feedback**

Employees have individual opinions about the quality of leadership in the company. They know their engagement levels at the workplace. They understand what hinders their performance & satisfaction. Unless the management is prepared to receive and analyze their objective feedback, no worthwhile initiatives can be launched to apply timely corrections. The end-result could be lower productivity and increasing disharmony.

### Ø **Workplace relationship problems**

Conflict in the workplace is generally the result of serious disagreement over needs or goals, and can result in behaviours such as gossip, backbiting, avoidance, verbal abuse, passive/aggressive communication, and hostility. This can in turn lead to a drop in productivity, a focus on problems rather than solutions, and a slump in creativity and innovation. While tensions and misunderstandings are normal and inevitable, if left unresolved they result in hostility, stress and wasted resources. Workplace relationship problems can arise as a result of the following:

- Clashing personalities
- Miscommunication
- Perceived gossiping and backbiting
- Negative politics or a perception of hidden agendas
- At work there are many who side up to the boss and do things that please them. Most of the time, achievement of such people is also to showcase others shortcomings (and not their own strengths!)

These factors create bad relations between people, and are generally the result of not following proper communication models, or of grudges built from the outset of a relationship where initial problems were not addressed.

### **Creating a Healthy Work Environment**

A nice work place is one where the people have joy and harmony in each other's company. It is surely a more efficient organization. Unfortunately, many organizations' harmony is wrecked by backbiting. So let's all work to eradicate it. Not possible? Then let's strive to, at least, minimize it. Let's start with ourselves. Now that we know the psychology behind backbiting, the next time you feel the urge to do it, ask yourself, "Do I really want to reveal my insecurity and jealous tendencies?"

On the other hand, if the person you are talking with starts speaking ill of another person, you can be sure that that person has a lot of insecurities and is jealous of the other person's advantages. Instead of fanning the fire—and revealing your own insecurity and jealousy—why don't you discreetly change the topic? It is, of course, no justification for their undesirable behavior but you can at least see why they do it, and that helps you cope up with them better. In most instances, it's better to *just ignore them*, even if it's so humanly tempting to hit back. Your *ability to restrain* yourself from hitting back is a measure of the strength of your character.

Let's join the campaign to eradicate backbiting.

“ తల్లీ ( ఓ భరత మాతా ) నీకు వందనం, తియ్యని జలాలతో, కమ్మని ఫలాలతో, చల్లని మలయ మారుతాలతో, పచ్చని పైర్లతో విలసిల్లే తల్లీ నీకు వందనం. పండు వెన్నెల రాత్రులలో విరబూసిన తారలతో శోభిస్తూ, స్వచ్ఛమైన నవ్వులతో, మధురమైన మాటలతో మాకు సుఖాలను కల్గిస్తూ వరాలనిచ్చే - తల్లీ నీకు వందనం ! ”

చూశారా ! భావమెంత మధురంగా వుందో, ఈ గేయాన్ని వినగానే ప్రతి భారతీయుని హృదయం పులకరిస్తుంది. తెల్లదొరల చేతిలో బందిగా వున్న దేశమాత సంకెళ్లను చేదించమని, భారతదేశ స్వాతంత్ర్య సాధనకోసం ఎందరికో స్ఫూర్తి నిచ్చింది.

ఈ గేయాన్ని రాసింది బంకించంద్ర ఛటర్జీ అనే పండితుడు ఈ గేయం ఎందుకు రాయవలసి వచ్చిందో తెలుసా. ఆ రోజులలో లార్డ్ కర్జన్ దొర మన దేశానికి బ్రిటీష్ వైస్రాయిగా ఉండేవాడు. ఆ దొర హిందువులను, ముస్లిములను విడదీసి వారి మధ్య గొడవలు రేపేవాడు, అలా రెండుగా విభజించాడు. విభజించి పాలించడం బ్రిటీషు పాలకులకు వెన్నతో పెట్టిన విద్య. ఆలాంటి సందర్భంలో ప్రజలలో దేశభక్తిని పెంచడానికి, మాతృభూమిని కాపాడుకోవడానికి మన బంకించంద్ర ఛటర్జీ యీ గేయాన్ని రచించాడు. ఈ గేయంతో ప్రజలలో చైతన్యం పట్టుదల పెరిగింది. అదే మహామంత్రంగా పనిచేసి “వందేమాతరం” ఉద్యమాన్ని సృష్టించింది. ఈ గీతాన్ని 1930 లో జాతీయ కాంగ్రెస్ మహాసభలో జాతీయ గీతంగా గుర్తించారు.

వంద సంవత్సరాలనాటి సంగతి మహారాష్ట్రలోని దఫాలే గ్రామం. అక్కడ గవర్నమెంటు స్కూలులో కొత్తగా ఆనందరావు, భీమారావు అనే ఇద్దరు అన్నదమ్ములు ఒకటో తరగతి చేరారు. అందరిలాగా వారు జీతంకట్టి చదువుకునే పిల్లలే ! కానీ అందరు పిల్లలతో కలసి కూచోడానికి వీలులేదు. వారిద్దరూ గోడవారగా దూరం కూచోవాలి. వారు కూచోడానికి గోనెసంచులు వారివే ! వారికి దప్పిక ఇతే సైగలు చేయాలి. తోటి పిల్లలు ఎవరయినా దయదలచి చేతుల్లో మంచి నీళ్ళు పోస్తే దోసిటితో తాగాలి. లేకపోతే లేదు. టీచర్లు కూడా వారి వంక చూడరు. వాళ్ల నోటుపుస్తకాలు దిద్దరు. మన ఊళ్లల్లో మాలపల్లెలు ఊరికి దూరంగా వుండేవి. అక్కడ ఉండేవారనీ చాలా కాలం ఊళ్లోకి రానిచ్చేవారు కాదు. వారిని అంటరానివారు అని పిలిచేవారు. ఇలాంటివాళ్లే మహారాష్ట్రలో మహర్షు ఆనందరావు, భీమారావులు మహారు కులంలో పుట్టడమే వారు చేసిన పాపం కాని తెలివి ఎవరి అబ్బ సొమ్ము ? చదువులో మహర్ పిల్లలే మిగతావారి కంటే చాల మెరుగు. టీచర్లలో వాళ్లంటే ఇష్టం ఏర్పడింది. చిన్నవాడైన భీమ్రావ్ కు 'అంబేద్కర్' అని పేరు పెట్టింది వారి మేష్టారే !

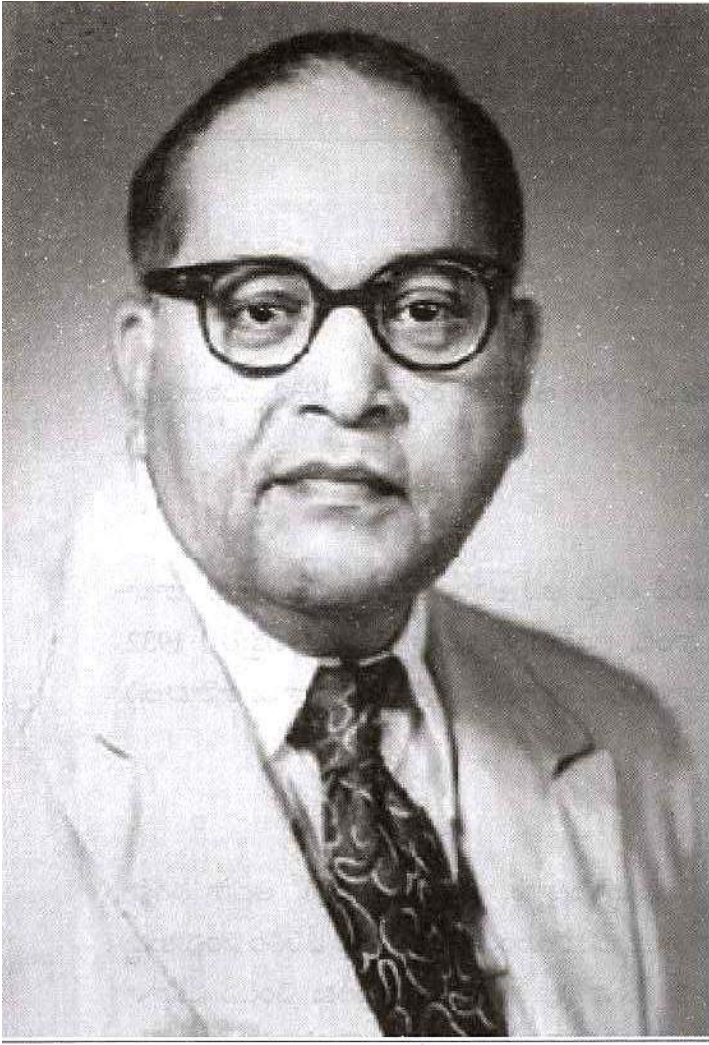
**కుటుంబం, హైస్కూలులో చదువు**

మహారాష్ట్ర దేశంలో మహర్ కులం వాడైన రామ్జీసక్పాల్ కాబవాడేకర్. ఆయన భార్య భీమాబాయి. వీరికి 14 మంది పిల్లలు పుట్టారు. కానీ ఐదుగురు మాత్రమే బ్రతికి బట్టకట్టారు. అఖరున పుట్టిన వాడు భీమ్రావ్. భీమ్రావ్ కు ఆరేండ్ల వయస్సులో తల్లి చనిపోయింది. రామ్జీ కుటుంబం మహర్ అనే కంటోన్మెంటులో ఉన్నరోజుల్లో అది 1891 ఏప్రిల్ 14 న పుట్టిన మగ పిల్లవానికి భీమ్రావ్ అని పేరు పెట్టారు. 1900 లో రామ్జీ రెండవ పెండ్లి చేసుకున్నాడు. తొమ్మిదేళ్ళ భీమ్రావ్ కు ఇది చాలి వింతగా తోచింది. తన తల్లి స్థానంలో మరి ఒకరు రావడం ఆయనకు నచ్చలేదు. ఇంటిలో నుండి పారిపోవాలనుకున్నాడు. వాళ్ల ఇంటిలో భీమ్రావ్ మేనత్త వుండేది. ఆమెకు భీమ్రావ్ అంటే చాలా ఇష్టం. ఆమె సహాయంతో బొంబాయి వెళ్ళిపోయాడు. భీమ్రావ్ అక్కడ ఎలిఫిన్స్టన్ హైస్కూలులో చేరాడు. అంబేద్కర్ ఎన్నో అవమానాలు భరిస్తూనే మెట్రిక్యులేషను పరీక్ష నెగ్గాడు. 1848 అంటరాని బాలలకోసం జ్యోతిరావుపూలే ఓం ప్రధమంగా పాఠశాల పెట్టాడు.

**పెండ్లి, పై చదువులు**

అంబేద్కరుకు 1907 లో 17 వ ఏట పెండ్లి అయింది. భార్యపేరు రమాబాయి. అప్పటికి ఆమె వయస్సు 9 ఏండ్లు. ఆమెకు మొదట చదువు ఏమాత్రం రాదు. అంబేద్కరే పట్టుబట్టి చదువు నేర్పించారు. అయితే కుటుంబాన్ని చక్కగా నడుపుకునేది. చాలా కష్టపడి 1910 లో అంబేద్కర్ ఇంటర్మీడియట్ పరీక్ష పాస్ అయినాడు. బి.ఎ





చదవాలంటే ఆయన దగ్గర డబ్బులు లేవు. 1912 లో బి.ఏ.పాస్ అయిన అంటేద్కరు బరోడా మహారాజా సాయంతో అమెరికా వెళ్ళారు. రోజుకు 18 గంటలు చదివేవారు. 1915 లో అంటేద్కర్ ఎం.ఏ పట్టా తీసుకున్నారు. 1917లో లండన్ చేరిన అంటేద్కరు ఎం.ఎస్.సిలో చేరారు. కానీ డబ్బులకు ఇబ్బంది మధ్యలోనే చదువు మానుకుని తిరిగి వచ్చేసారు.

### బరోడాలో ఉద్యోగం, కాలేజీ లెక్చరర్

బరోడా రాజాగారి కొలువులో 1917 లో ఉద్యోగంలో అంటేద్కరు చేరారు. ఆఫీసులో గుమస్తాలు ఆయన దగ్గరకు వచ్చేవారు కారు. పైళ్లను జవాన్ల ద్వారా పంపేవారు. అక్కడ ఆయన ఎన్నో అవమానాలు

ఎదురైనాయి. ఆపరిస్థితులలో అంటేద్కరు బొంబాయి చేరారు. 1918 లో అంటేద్కరుకు ప్రభుత్వ కళాశాలలో లెక్చరరుగా ఉద్యోగం వచ్చింది. విద్యార్థులు కూడా మొదట ఆయన కులాన్ని బట్టి తగిన గౌరవం ఇచ్చేవారు కారు. తీరా ఆయన పాఠాలు చెప్పే పద్ధతి చూచి ఈయన ఎంతటి మేధావి! అని గుర్తించారు. 1920 లో రాజావారి సాయంతో 'మూక్ నాయక్' అనే పత్రిక నడిపారు. మూక్ నాయక్ అంటే నీరులేనివారి నాయకుడు అని అర్థం. అంటేద్కరు ఈ పత్రికలో వ్యాసాలు రాసేవారు.

### తిరిగి చదువుకోసం లండన్, లాయర్ గా అంటేద్కరు

డబ్బుకు ఇబ్బందిపడి 1917లో లండన్ లో చదువు అంటేద్కరు మధ్యలో ఆపివేశారు. 1920లో కొంత డబ్బు జమచేసుకొని ఆయన తిరిగి లండన్ వెళ్లాడు. మూడు సంవత్సరాలు అక్కడ చదివి మూడు డిగ్రీలు పొందారు. ఒకటి ఎం.ఎస్.సి. రెండవది డి.ఎస్.సి. మూడవది బార్.ఎట్ -లా (న్యాయవాది పట్టా). 1923 జూన్ లో బొంబాయి చేరిన అంటేద్కరు వకీలుగా బోర్డు కట్టారు. జిల్లాలలో ఉండే కోర్టులకు ఆయన వెళ్లేవారు. బ్రాహ్మణులు, ఇతర కులాల వారి మధ్య జరిగిన గొడవ కోర్టు దాకా వెళ్లింది. ఇందులో అంటేద్కరు వాదించిన పార్టీ గెలిచింది. దీనితో అంటేద్కరు గొప్ప లాయరు అని పేరు వచ్చింది.

### శాసన మండలిలో, ఇంగ్లండు సమావేశాలు

బొంబాయి శాసన మండలి సభ్యునిగా అంటేద్కరు 1927 లో నియమితులైనారు. బడుగు వర్గాలకోసం 1928 జూన్ లో అంటేద్కరు రెండు హాస్టళ్ళను తెరిచారు. భారతదేశం పరిపాలనలో మార్పులకోసం మూడుసార్లు రెండు







టేబుల్ సమావేశాలు జరిగారి 1930 నవంబరులో మొదటిది. 1931 ఆగస్టులో రెండవది, 1932 నవంబరులో మూడవది వరుసగా రౌండ్ టేబుల్ సమావేశాలు జరిగాయి.

### గాంధీ - అంబేద్కర్

మనం గాంధీజీని 'బాపూ' అని పిలుస్తుంటాం. ### విరామం ఎరుగని శ్రమజీవి, విలువైన సలహాలు

1934 జూన్ లో అంబేద్కరు న్యాయవాదిగా తిరిగి పని మొదలు పెట్టారు. న్యాయకాళాశాలలో అడపా దడపా పాఠాలు చెప్పేవారు. 1938 మే నెలలో ఆయన భార్య రమాబాయి చనిపోయింది. 30 ఏళ్ళ తన జీవితం పంచుకున్న భార్య మరణం ఆయనను క్రుంగదీసింది. 1942 జూలై 28 న నాగపూర్ లో నిమ్మజాతులకు చెందిన మహిళా సభలు జరిగాయి. వైస్రాయి కౌన్సిల్ సభ్యత్వం 1942 నుండి 1946 సెప్టెంబరు వరకు కొనసాగారు.

### రాజ్యాంగ రచన

1947 జూలై 16న బ్రిటిష్ పార్లమెంట్ సమావేశం జరిగింది. 1947 ఆగస్టు 3న కేంద్ర న్యాయశాఖ మంత్రిగా నియమించారు. 1947 ఆగస్టు 20 న రాజ్యాంగ రచనకమిటీ అధ్యక్షత వహించారు. 1948 ఏప్రిల్ 18న రెండవ పెండ్లి చేసుకున్నారు. ఆమె బ్రాహ్మణ కుటుంబానికి చెందినా అంబేద్కరును అమితంగా ప్రేమించింది. 1956 అక్టోబరు 14 బౌద్ధమత దీక్ష తీసుకున్నారు. జీవితకాలం అంటరానివారి కోసం బడుగు వర్గాల కోసం శ్రమించిన అంబేద్కరు మహాశయుడు 1956 డిసెంబరు 6వ తేదీన కాలధర్మం చెందారు. ఆయనను భారతజాతి ఎన్నటికీ మరిచిపోదు.

चूँकि या सारा काम ऑनलाईन होता है । तो भूलचूक की संभावना ना के बराबर होती है । मगर फिर भी कुछ शातिर लोग आपको चूना लगा सकते है । आपकी तक छोटी सी गलती आपका पूरा अकाउंट खाली कर सकती है । अतः ऑनलाइन भुगतान करते वक्त इन बातों को विशेष ध्यान रखना है ।

एक्टिवेट हो जाना है। अतः फौरन नया पासवर्ड बदल लें।

अपना पासवर्ड किसी को भी ना बताएँ। यहाँ तक कि आप का पासवर्ड बैंक के कर्मचारी, मैनेजर या कस्टमर केयर आदि किसी को भी नहीं बताना।

कोशिश यही करनी चाहिए की जहाँ तक हो सके ई बैंकिंग अपने ही पर्सनल कंप्यूटर पर ही किया जाए। साइबर कैफे या किसी भी परिचित के कंप्यूटर का प्रयोग ना ही करे तो बेहतर है।

यदि मजबूरी से साइबर कैफे या अन्य का कंप्यूटर प्रयोग कर रहे है तो मोजिला फायरफोक्स या इन्टरनेट एक्सप्लोरर का लेटस्ट प्रयोग करें। लेटस्ट साफ्टवेर मे प्राइवेट ब्राउसिंग आसान होता है जो आपकी लॉगिन डाटा को सेव करता है।

बैंक कभी भी अपने यूजर को लॉगिन पासवर्ड या प्राइवेट जानकारी से सम्बन्धित ई मेल नहीं भेजता है। यदि आपको कोई ऐसा मेल मिले जो आपकी ई बैंकिंग जानकारी को पूछे तो आप तुरंत उसे डिलीट कर दें। बैंक द्वारा समय-समय पर आपको ईमेल के माध्यम से यही अवगत कराया जाता है कि कोई कितना भी पूछे, आई डी अन्ड पासवर्ड किसी को नहीं बनाना।

बच्चों को अपना एटीएम कभी ना प्रयोग करने दें। उसके लिए अलग से अकाउंट खुलवा देना एक अच्छा विकल्प है।

यह अंतरजाल का युग मानव को भौतिक शक्तियों पर विषय प्राप्त करने के लिए प्रेरित करता है। इन्हीं शक्तियों के कारण हम अनेक महत्वपूर्ण कार्य सम्पादित करते हैं। आज हम जो विकास की उँचाई माप रहे हैं, उसमें अंतरजाल एवं विज्ञान का योगदान सर्वोपरि है।

अंतरजाल का योगदान : हमारे मानव जीवन में अंतरजाल के योगदान इतना ज्यादा है कि हम इसे शब्दों में प्रकट नहीं कर सकते हैं। अंतरजाल का योगदान मानव - जीवन और समाज पर गहरी भूमिका निभाती है। अतः अंतरजाल मानव जीवन को सरल बना दिया है। आज हम घर बैठ पूरे कार्य करने में सक्षम हैं। हम अपने कमरे पर ही सारी दुनियाँ की स्थिति मालूम करते हैं। बिना किसी बाधा के हमें सब - कुछ समाचार घर पर ही मिल जाती है। अतः अंतरजाल के योगदान के कारण ही पूरी दुनिया एक गाँव की भाँति बन गया है।

**उपसंहार :** अंतरजाल की प्रगति के विषय में जितना कहा जाए उतना ही कम है । अतः हमें अंतरजाल को वरदान के रूप में प्रयोग करना चाहिए न कि अभिशाप के रूप में । और अंतरजाल तभी वरदान साबित होगा जब हम इसका सृजनात्मक उपयोग करेंगे । और नहीं तो गलत उपयोग करने पर अभिशाप साबित होगा ही । परन्तु यह सब - कुछ प्रत्येक व्यक्ति पर ही निर्भर करता है । वह अपना जीवन बना सकता है । और बिगाड़ भी सकता है ।





## स्त्री साधिकारता और सरकार का सहयोग

प्रिंट मीडिया के अंतर्गत समाचार पत्र, आखबार, मैगजीन एवं पत्राचार इत्यादि आते हैं। समाचार पत्रों तथा मैगजीनों पर प्रसारित विज्ञापनों के प्रभाव में आकर आज के युवा अपने सामान्य जीवन शैली से बहुत दूर भटक गये हैं। जिसके कारण वे अन्य कठिनाइयों का सामना करते हैं। फैशन की दुनिया में अपनी पढ़ाई - लिखाई को भूल जाते हैं जिसके कारण उनका जीवन बर्बाद की ओर बढ़ता जाता है।

**इलेक्ट्रानिक मीडिया का प्रभाव :**

इलेक्ट्रानिक मीडिया के अंतर्गत दूरदर्शन टेलीविजन, सिनेमा, रेडियो, मोबाइल फोन इत्यादि आते हैं। तकनीकियों के अनुसंधानों एवं विकास के कारण संसार इतना आगे बढ़ रहा है कि युवा वर्ग उसीके पीछे भागने की कोशिश कर रही है। इसके फलस्वरूप युवा वर्ग विनाशकारी गहराई की ओर बढ़े चल जा रही है। टी.वी चैनलों पर प्रसारित विज्ञापनों एवं अभिनेयकों के अभिनय, उनके रहन-सहन, स्टाइलों एवं आदतों पर इस तरह फिदा हैं कि वे अभिनयकों अपना मॉडल मान लेते हैं। उनकी तरह बात व्यवहार करना आरंभ करते हैं तथा विभिन्न प्रकार के फैशनदार कपड़ों के साथ मोटरगाड़ियों पर सवार होकर घूमते हैं। अपनी पढ़ाई को कोशों दूर छोड़कर मौज मस्ती के जीवन





में उतर जाते हैं। मोबाइल फोन के अविष्कार ने युवा वर्ग को बुरी तरह प्रभावित किया है। दिन भर ये मोबाइल पर व्यस्त रहकर समय की बर्बादी का भी जरा सा ख्याल नहीं करते। जिसके कारण वे हरदम पढ़ाई में पीछे पड़ जाते हैं। उस प्रकार इलेक्ट्रॉनिक मीडिया भी युवा वर्ग पर बुरा असर डालती है।

नयी मीडिया का प्रभाव :

नयी मीडिया की बढ़ोतरी एवं सहज उपलब्धता ने युवाओं को अपने जाल में फँसा ली है। नयी मीडिया के अंतर्गत इंटरनेट या अंतरजाल आता है। जब से अंतरजाल की उपलब्धता आयी है तब से युवा वर्ग उसके पीछे पागल है। घंटों नेट पर इ.मेल एवं फेस बुक, ट्वीटर इत्यादि में सिनेमा देखते हैं। एवं बुरी आदतों के शिकार बन जाते हैं। वे बुरी आदतों की अपना लेते हैं जैसे सिगरेट पीना, नशापान करना एवं गुटका खाना गंदे सिनेमा देखना इत्यादि। ये सभी तकनीकियों के विकास का नतीजा है। अंतरजाल ने तो युवाओं के भविष्य को ही खतरे में रख दिया है। पढ़ाई तो दूर की बात लोग कभी स्कूलों एवं कालेजों में कदम नहीं रखते। माता पिता से पैसा मांगकर अंतरजाल एवं सिनेमाघरों में उपस्थित हो जाते हैं। अतः ये नयी तकनीकियों का विकास युवा वर्ग के लिए अशीर्वाद नहीं बल्कि अभिशाप है।

निष्कर्ष :

मीडिया का दुष्प्रभाव युवा वर्ग पर इतना फैला हुआ है कि इससे बच पाना युवाओं के लिए नामुमकिन सा लगता है। दुनिया के प्रत्येक कोने में मीडिया का प्रभाव जन-जन में बना हुआ है। लोग उसके प्रभाव में आकर बुरी आदतों से पीछे नहीं हटते। जिससे वे बर्बादी को अपनी ओर स्वागत करते हैं। इस तरह हम पाते हैं कि मीडिया का दुष्प्रभाव वर्तमान समय के युवा वर्ग पर काफी गहरा है।



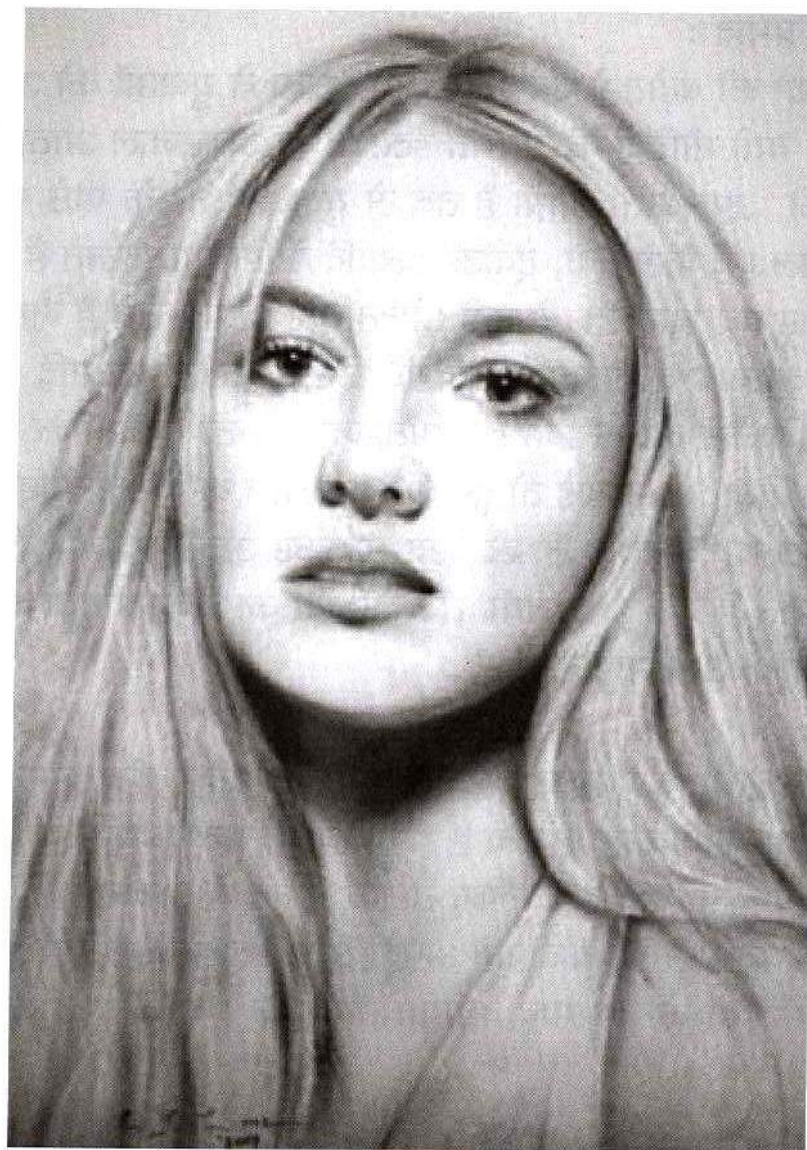
