
1. GUEST LECTURE

(ii) G.Jyotsna, President of SAFE (Step Ahead For Equality) was the chief guest.


(iii)Mrs. G.Jyotsna addressed the gathering and enlightened the young minds to make a positive impact on the journey towards gender equality.
