

The Ministry of Labour and Employment launched the E-Shram portal on August 26, 2021 with an objective of developing a national database of the unorganized workers. Under this scheme, any worker between the age group of 16-59 is eligible for the E-Shram card. The card holders will get an accident insurance coverage of Rs 2,00,000 if they lose their lives in an accident or permanently disabled. They will also get an amount of Rs. 1,00,000 for any partial disability. Our UG students conducted an E-Shram drive from 01.11.2021 to 19.11.2021 and registered 250 unorganized labour under this scheme. This drive was organized at Christurajupuram, Gangiredduladibba and Gundala areas of Vijayawada.





COVID VACCINATION DRIVE:

Andhra Loyola College under the College Extension Programme organized a Covid Vaccination Drive for the benefit of staff and students on 09.11.2021. Rev. Fr. Dr. S. Melchior, SJ, Treasurer inaugurated the programme and spoke on the importance of vaccines in controlling the viruses. He told one should never forget that prevention is better than cure.
