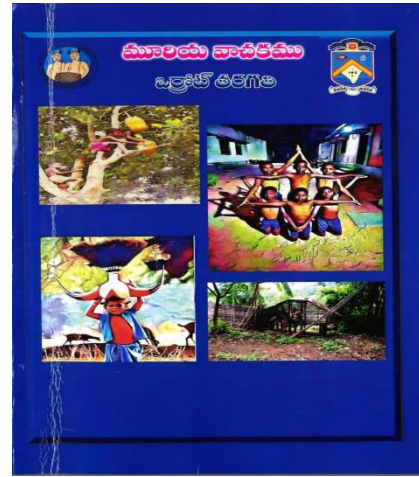
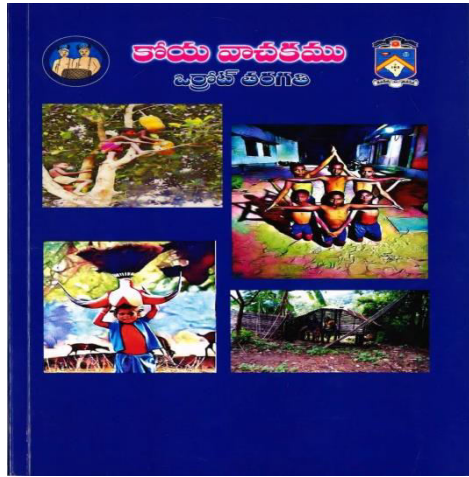
### EXTENSION ACTIVITIES UNDER MOU NGO's

#### I. ACTIVITIES WITH LITDS, KATUKAPALLY:

#### 1. PRESERVING LINGUISTIC DIVERSITY: ALC INITIATIVE IN INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE EDUCATION:

Multilingual and multicultural societies thrive on the preservation of their languages, which serve as conduits for traditional knowledge and cultural heritage. According to a recent United Nations report, the disappearance of languages signifies the loss of entire cultural and intellectual heritages at an alarming rate. Approximately 45% of the estimated 7,000 languages spoken worldwide are endangered, with only a fraction enjoying inclusion in education systems, public domains, or the digital realm. In response to these concerns, Andhra Loyola College has taken proactive measures during their visit to LITDS, Katukapally. Upon observing students from Koya and Muriya tribes conversing in their respective mother tongues while receiving instruction in Telugu, the predominant official language of Andhra Pradesh, College Principal Rev. Fr. G. A. P. Kishore SJ, recognized the urgency to preserve these indigenous languages. Consequently, the College spearheaded an initiative to print study materials in Koya and Muriya languages, a project culminating in the publication of 1000 copies of the 1st Class Reader in both languages (Koya & Muriya) with ISBN certification on December 3rd, 2020. Thanks to the collaborative effort of local experienced school teachers, hundreds of tribal children can now engage meaningfully with their studies in their mother tongue, safeguarding not only linguistic diversity but also the rich cultural heritage embedded within these languages.





**2. ALERT – TRIBAL EXPOSURE PROGRAMME IN COLLABORATION WITH LITDS, KATUKAPALLY:**

The first wave of covid-19 locked the people indoors, making them depressed and distressed rather than rejoicing and reorganizing themselves. People realized that loneliness is the real curse to human life. To instill and inspire the young learners, the management with all precautionary measures planned for a tribal visit to Kakutapalli, LITDS [Loyola Integrated Tribal Development Society]. A team of 40 students visited 12 villages at Chintoor Mandal and 6 Villages at Vararamachandrapuram Mandal of East Godavari Districts from 10<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> April 2021. All the eighteen villages were located in the interior parts of the Wild Forest range of West Godavari District. The students were divided into small groups and send to the selected tribal areas. As they were the initial days of the second wave of covid-19, the students concentrated more on safety measures of preventive measures from the wide spreading virus. They also spoke to the villagers on the burning issues like child marriages, addiction to alcohol and so on and their impact on their lives. They spoke to the elders and children the importance of health, hygiene, education, job and career. They urged them to continue their education despite the hardships, as it provides them a platform to lead a safe and secured life.





All the students actively participated in the programme exploring and engaging them to discover the true essence of their life. If you aim for a change, be the change. May be this motivated the students and in order to give a comprehensive view on the above, they thought words alone would not suffice



and they chose art forms to express clearly what the villagers need to know clearly.

Different stage shows were planned to explain the same. On the last day, solar lamps were distributed to the migrated tribes of the villages located at the borders of Chattisgarh and Odisha. Rev. Fr. G. Kiran Kumar, SJ Lecturer Dept. of Mathematics, Mr. R. John, Coordinator, Extension Activities and Rev. Fr. Yesuratnam, SJ Director, LITDS coordinated the entire programme.

### **3. PRESERVING LINGUISTIC DIVERSITY: ALC INITIATIVE IN INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE EDUCATION:**

In response to the ongoing concerns regarding Tribal School Children, Andhra Loyola College has taken proactive steps to safeguard indigenous languages. Leading this effort, the college initiated a project to produce study materials in Koya and Muriya languages. This endeavor resulted in successful publication of 1000 copies of the 2nd Class Reader in both languages, complete with ISBN certification, on July 31st, 2021. With the invaluable support of local experienced school teachers and Rev. Fr. K. Yesuratnam SJ, Program Coordinator at LITDS Katukapally, hundreds of tribal children now have the opportunity to meaningfully engage with their studies in their mother tongue. This initiative not only preserves linguistic diversity but also upholds the rich cultural heritage inherent in these languages.



### **4. INTERNATIONAL DAY OF WORLD'S IDIGENOUS PEOPLES:**

Student Volunteers of DOVE participated at the International Day of World Indigenous Peoples at Katukapalli, LITDS (Loyola Integrated Tribal Development Society) on 09.08.2021. Sri Sai Naik, Forest Range Officer,

Chintur was the chief Guest. He hoisted the flag at Yedugurallapalli. It was followed by a rally from Yedugurallapalli to LITDS emphasizing the importance of the day. All the tribal people, Adivasi Rights Activists along with the students and staff participated in the rally. An Early Tribes Museum was inaugurated at the premises of LITDS in memory of the early Adivasi's at Chintur Mandal. Rev. Fr. Yesuratnam, SJ Director, LITDS, Rev. Fr. Paul Amalraja, SJ Superior of Katukapalli Mission, Mr. R. John, Coordinator, Extension Activities coordinated the entire programme under ALERT.



## 5. ALERT – TRIBAL EXPOSURE PROGRAMME:

As part of our College ALERT Extension programme, our College Student Volunteers, comprising first-year degree students, embarked on a meaningful journey of exploration and learning. On the 15th and 16th of November 2021, they visited LITDS Katukapally, and on the 17th of November 2021, they ventured into the Pedomattapally tribal villages at VR Puram Mandal, in collaboration with the Yesupadam Charitable Society.



The primary objective of the visit was to provide our students with Tribal Exposure, an essential aspect of their educational experience under the ALERT Extension programme. During their time in the tribal villages, our students delved into the livelihood conditions of the primitive tribes, gaining insights into their cultivation methods, food habits, and health standards. They also had the opportunity to explore the forest resources, including the unique podu crops cultivated on the hills.

Immersing themselves in the lives of the tribal communities, our students experienced firsthand the challenges of living without modern facilities. They observed the traditional cultures adopted by these communities for their sustainability, despite the absence of basic amenities such as proper roads, drinking water, and electricity. This eye-opening experience provided our students with a deeper understanding of societal diversity and resilience. The entire programme was expertly coordinated by Mr. R John, Coordinator of Extension Activities, who ensured the smooth execution of the visit, facilitating valuable learning experiences for our student volunteers from LITDS Kakutapally.





## 6. SCIENTIFIC STUDY IN TRIBAL VILLAGES:

Each tribe possesses unique characteristics that contribute to its cultural lifestyle. In an effort to delve deeper into the cultural nuances of a specific tribe, the Department of Service Learning organized a Scientific Study at Kakutapalli, a Tribal Village in Chintur Mandal, from December 10th to December 13th, 2021. Dr. Venu Gopal, a Scientist from LAYA in Narasimpatnam, Visakhapatnam, served as the resource person for this endeavor.

During this initiative, under the ALERT Extension program, student volunteers had the opportunity to learn about the livelihood conditions of the primitive tribes, including their cultivation practices, food habits, and health standards. Moreover, they explored forest resources such as poodu crops on the hills. Mr. R. John, the Coordinator of Extension Activities, along with student volunteers from LITDS Kakutapally, coordinated the entire program, facilitating an enriching experience for all involved.







## 7. TRIBAL EXPOSURE PROGRAMME:

As part of our College ALERT Tribal exposure programme, in collaboration with Loyola Integrated Tribal Development Society (LITDS) Katukapally, and Yesupadam Charitable Society at Kunavaram and Chinturu Mandals a team of dedicated DOVE student Volunteers embarked on a transformative journey. From October 17 to October 18, 2022, they ventured into Tribal villages at Chintur Mandal. The primary focus of this expedition was to explore and understand the living conditions of the primitive tribes dwelling in Katukapally and Tatilanka villages.

During their visit, the DOVE volunteers immersed themselves in the tribal culture, gaining valuable insights into the unique livelihoods of these communities. The experience went beyond observation, allowing them to actively engage with the tribal residents and comprehend the challenges they face.

In addition to the cultural exchange, the volunteers took the opportunity to raise awareness on crucial health aspects, particularly focusing on providing valuable tips to combat epidemic infections during the rainy seasons. This extension of the program demonstrated a holistic approach, ensuring that the tribal exposure not only served as an educational experience but also contributed to the well-being and health awareness of the tribal communities visited.



## **8. AWARENESS CAMPAIGN:**

Engaging in the College ALERT Tribal exposure programme, our collaboration with Loyola Integrated Tribal Development Society (LITDS) Katukapally took an enlightening turn. The committed DOVE team ventured into the Guttikoya Tribe Villages, immersing themselves in the community and gaining valuable insights into the resources available. The interactive sessions revealed the unique ways in which the tribes sustain themselves, offering a glimpse into their lives without modern amenities such as electricity, particularly within the reserve forests. To further enrich the experience, the students organized and performed skits that conveyed crucial messages. The skits emphasized the importance of abstaining from alcohol, underscored the value of education, and encouraged parents to prioritize their children's education by enrolling them in the nearest school boarding facilities. During the period from December 12, 2022, to December 13, 2022, the comprehensive approach undertaken not only expanded the comprehension of tribal lifestyles but also sought to generate a positive impact on the community. The program involved the participation of Rev. Fr. Yesuratnam, Director of LITDS, Raja Babu, a Village Volunteer, as well as student volunteers and members of the tribal communities.

## EXTENSION ACTIVITIES UNDER MOU NGO's

### I. ACTIVITIES IN COLLABORATION WITH ITC AGENCY SURAJ KRISHNA GREENARIES

#### 1. DISTRIBUTION OF NEW A4 BUNDLES & OFFICE STATIONERY:

“Reduce, Reuse and Recycle” for the effective use of resources and materials Andhra Loyola College collaborated with ITC Agency Suraj Krishna Greenaries to promote Eco friendly environment.

Every year the old records and used papers are collected from each Department and sent for recycling. Around 1.5 tons of Dry waste were collected for this purpose and in return gained 9 boxes of 70 GSM A4 Bundles and other office stationery items worth Rs. 19,220/-. Suraj Krishna Greenaries distributed the new materials to each Department on 26<sup>th</sup> April, 2021. Rev. Fr. Dr. G.A.P. Kishore, Principal, Mr. Shashi ITC – WOW Outreach Coordinator Rev. Fr. S. Melchior SJ participated in the programme.





## 2. AWARENESS ON WASTE SEGREGATION:

On August 2, 2022, ALANA, in collaboration with ITC – WOW (Well-being out of Waste) represented by SURAJ KRISHNA GREENARIES, conducted an awareness program on Waste Segregation. This initiative aimed at promoting sustainable waste management practices and was a collaborative effort to foster environmental consciousness within the ALC College community.

Mr. Shashi, ITC – WOW Outreach Coordinator, played a pivotal role in providing comprehensive training to the sweepers and sanitary workers of ALC College. The focus of the training was on the meticulous separation of dry and wet waste, along with highlighting effective methods for preserving dry waste. Valuable insights were shared by Mr. Shashi on distinguishing between recyclable and non-recyclable waste, emphasizing the significance of recycling in waste management.



Moreover, the session included practical suggestions for sweepers and sanitary workers on optimizing the use of wet waste by converting it into high-quality manure for plants within our campus. Sri. Ramana, Non-Teaching Supervisor, and Mr. R. John, Extension Work Coordinator, actively participated in the program, reinforcing the commitment of ALC College to sustainability and creating a greener environment. This initiative not only educated the staff on effective waste segregation but also encouraged the implementation of eco-friendly practices for a healthier and cleaner campus.

## 3. DISTRIBUTION OF NEW A4 BUNDLES & OFFICE STATIONARY:

Annually, the ITC agency SURAJ KRISHNA GREENARIES diligently gathered paper waste from old records across all departments. Based on the weight of the collected waste, they generously provided new stationary and A4 bundles. This year, a substantial amount of 1.96 tons of dry waste was amassed. In a noteworthy gesture, on August 18, 2022, they delivered new stationary and A4 bundles, valued at Rs. 27,450/- in recognition of the dry waste lifted.

The received items included 10 boxes of 70 GSM A4 bundles and office stationary, which were handed over to Rev. Fr. Dr. G.A.P. Kishore, Principal of ALC. In a

collaborative effort Mr. Shashi ITC – WOW Outreach Coordinator, and Sri. R. John Extension Coordinator actively participated in the program, reinforcing the commitment to sustainable practices and environmental consciousness. The distributed materials were thoughtfully allocated to the respective departments, marking a meaningful contribution to the college's ongoing efforts in waste management and sustainability.



#### 4. COMMEMORATING GANDHI JAYANTHI:

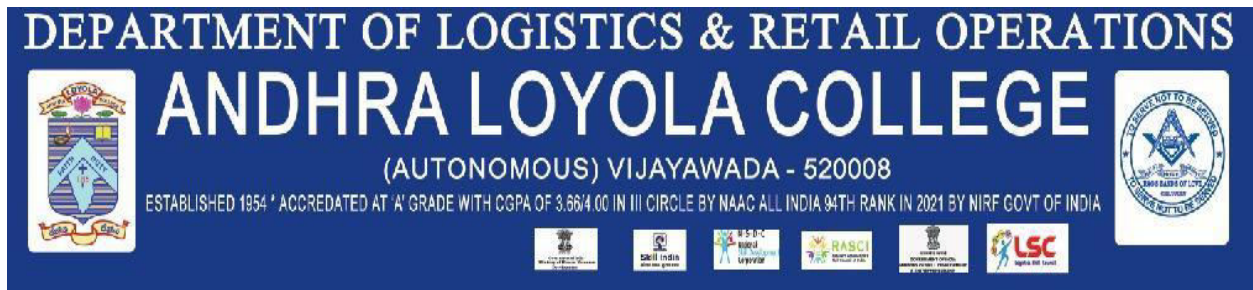

## **LSC History with MHRD**

Logistics Sector Skill Council (LSC), established by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through National Skill Development Corporation of India (NSDC), has launched Apprenticeship-based higher education programmes both in humanities and technology disciplines with the primary objective of creating adequate skills for gainful employment at various levels of managerial cadre in Logistics Industry.

The core focus of the programmes is Skill Development, through on-the Job Training in the form of Industry Apprenticeship.

## **Fees payment to LSC**

Payment of fees to LSC should be made according to the specified schedule and guidelines. Every College has to Pay Prescribed fee to LSC within the time.

If failure to pay the fee could pose various problems for the college, ultimately leading to direct negative impacts on the students.

## **Duration of the Apprenticeship**

Two years in the Campus (College) and the final year in apprenticeship, where the real-world experience comes to life.

## **Required Skillet for getting Apprenticeship**

LSC will allocate an apprenticeship to you in a logistics company.LSC is capable of providing good number of opportunities regarding Apprenticeship in reputed Companies in India but Student responsibly is to clear the Interview.

Major Skills required for Interview

1. Conceptual Skills
2. Communication Skills
3. Computer Skills especially in MS Excel

## **Contract Generation &Transfer / Relocation**

LSC is responsible for generating contracts for students getting apprenticeship in the Companies. Students are required to adhere to the rules outlined in the Contract Agreement during their apprenticeship.

Transfer or relocation may be necessary for apprenticeship; it is depending on the Student requirements and based on the Company Policy.



### **NAPS registration -student / candidate**

If you wish to pursue an apprenticeship near your area or if your relatives working in that company, it's essential to verify whether that company is registered under the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS).

If you want to do Apprenticeship near to your area or your Relatives are working in that Particular Company you need to verify whether that Company registered in National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS). If it's not registered, you can request them or ask them to register with NAPS."

### **Timings at work**

The apprenticeship program at the company typically involves a substantial daily commitment, with participants expected to dedicate themselves to work for a period spanning from 9 hours to up to 12 hours, allowing them to gain a comprehensive understanding of the industry and develop valuable skills during their tenure.

### **Rules & Regulations at company**

In accordance with the company's rules and regulations, students are required to adhere to them diligently; failure to do so may result in corrective actions, including disciplinary measures, being taken by the company authorities.

### **Location change**

While typically, there is no flexibility to change the location once the contract has been generated in the student's name by the company, in cases where the company is favorable to facilitating transfers or changes in location, that time will have a chance for changing without any complications.

### **Apprenticeship companies location (Cities)**

LSC offers students the opportunity for paid apprenticeships in thriving metropolitan hubs such as Bangalore, Mumbai, Chennai, Gurgaon, Delhi, Kolkata, and Hyderabad, providing a valuable stepping stone to their professional journey.

### **Stipend Amount**

Minimum Apprenticeship Payment is Rs 7,500, Maximum based on the Student Performance in the Interview and based on the Company. A reputed company like 'Bosch' is giving good amount of Apprenticeship but Student has to clear all rounds in the Interview.

The Minimum Apprenticeship Payment of Rs 7,500 serves as a foundation, while the maximum amount, determined by student performance in the interview can provide substantial opportunities for growth; companies like 'Bosch' exemplify this by offering generous apprenticeship packages, provided students excel in all interview rounds.

### **Warehouse Role (Picker Role) & Executive Role**

**Those exceptionally capable students are destined to be positioned for prestigious executive roles within the organization.**

Students showcasing their exceptional capabilities are destined for executive roles for Apprenticeship within the organization

If Students are lacking conceptual skills, communication skills, and technical abilities will place in Warehouse as Picker Role

Hence Students must ardently strive to work hard for developing the following skills.

1. Conceptual Skills
2. Communication Skills
3. Computer Skills especially in MS Excel

### **Difficulty in Job Role**

Student life is happier in the College days or in the Hostels, even at home. Majority of the Students have no Problems, no worries and everything seems to be happy but once if you want Join in the Apprenticeship you have to lose your Comforts in terms of away from home, working long Hours, hard work, and many more.

Being away from home for my apprenticeship has allowed to you gain valuable skills working hard during the initial days in Apprenticeship sets a strong foundation for success of the Students.

### **Assessment Test**

The Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) Component of Apprenticeship is assessed by the Manager / Supervisor under whom the students work during Apprenticeship Semesters and LSC for a maximum mark of 250. The Manager / Supervisor makes the assessment for 150 marks based on skill & attitudinal development of students. LSC assess the practical knowledge of students for 100 marks by conducting a Test on conceptual knowledge relevant to the process undergone during Apprenticeship, and Viva.



The Collaborating Institution evaluates the Apprenticeship Report (comprising Work Diary) submitted by students, and conduct Viva for a mark of 150, which is considered as End Semester Examination (ESE). The Evaluation & Viva is conducted by a Panel comprising of the HoD (or Programme Coordinator), Student's Mentor, and an Executive from Logistics Sector.
