1. COVID-19 AWARENESS PROGRAMME FOR RAG PICKERS:

As a part of the College Extension Wing, Covid-19 Awareness Programme was organized for the rag pickers at Poranki, Penamaluru and Pathapadu areas from 26th to 28th June 2021. This programme was organized in collaboration with Dalit Bahujan Resource Center (DBRC), Guntur. Rev. Fr. G. Rayappa SJ Vice Principal, Rev. Fr. Bala SJ, Director, Magic Youth stressed on the importance of wearing face mask, which alone can protect them from the virus. They also explained how social distancing would help them to be away from the disease. They told if they have any symptoms, they should immediately inform the ward Sachivalayam staff for immediate action. Face masks were distributed to all the rag pickers and slum dwellers. Ms. Jhansi, DBRC, Area Coordinator and Mr. R. John, Coordinator, Extension Work coordinated the entire programme.





2. ONE DAY SEMINAR ON SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF SCS & STS IN A.P ISSUES CHALLENGES & WAY FORWARD:

The Extension Centre, Andhra Loyola College in collaboration with Department of Social Sciences and Dalit Bahujan Resource Center (DBRC) organized a one-day Seminar on **Socio-Economic Development of SCs and STs in A.P, Issues, Challenges and Way Forward** at the Old Seminar Hall on 25.09.2021. John, Coordinator of Extension Activities, were present alongside 70 rag pickers from both urban and rural areas of Vijayawada who actively participated in the programme.



4. STATE LEVEL CONFERENCE FOR FIELD-LEVEL WOMEN WORKERS:

On July 29, 2022, a State-level conference for Field-level Women Workers was organized collaboratively with the Dalit Bahujan Resource Center (DBRC) Guntur, extending invitations to women sanitation workers from both Vijayawada Rural and Urban areas. The event served as a significant platform to acknowledge and appreciate the dedicated services provided by these women daily for the well-being of the public in our society.



Sri. MD. Imtiaz IAS, CEO SERP, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest, expressing his gratitude to all sanitation workers for their unwavering dedication. He assured the attendees that the issues faced at the field level would be brought to the consideration of the Chief Minister's desk, with subsequent actions planned in the coming days.

Adding to the depth of the conference, Prof. Saraswati Raju Iyer, Head of the Department of Sociology & Social Work and Dean of Social Sciences at Acharya Nagarjuna University, Guntur, attended as the Guest Speaker. EXTENSION ACTIVIES UNDER MOU NGO's

I. ACTIVITIES IN COLLOBORATION WITH YESUPADAM CHARITABLE SOCIETY

1. ALANA – PILLALLA PANDUGA:

Andhra Loyola College, in collaboration with the Yesupadam Charitable Society, organized the Pillala Panduga Programme with the aim of not only entertaining but also educating street children in the Penamaluru, Poranki, and Krishna Lanka areas of Vijayawada. The initiative sought to provide these underprivileged children with a day filled with joy and learning on 14/11/2021.

The DOVE volunteers from Andhra Loyola College took charge of coordinating various competitions, including drawing, elocution, and running races, which were met with overwhelming enthusiasm from the participating children. It was heartwarming to witness the smiles on their faces as they engaged wholeheartedly in the activities provided for them.



Prizes were awarded to the winners to recognize their achievements. The event saw participation from Ms. Zarika, a teacher from Navjeevan Bridge School in Poranki, members and staff of the Yesupadam Charitable Society, Mr. John, the Coordinator of Extension Activities, along with 20 student volunteers. In total, nearly 120 school children enjoyed and engaged in the programme.



2. ALERT – TRIBAL EXPOSURE PROGRAMME:

As part of our College ALERT Extension programme, our first-year degree students, serving as College Student Volunteers, embarked on a meaningful journey of exploration. From the 15th to the 16th of November 2021, they immersed themselves in the community of LITDS Katukapally. Subsequently, on the 17th of November 2021, they continued their mission by visiting the Yesupadam Charitable Society.

During these visits, our students conducted a comprehensive livelihood study among the tribal villages, seeking to gain Tribal Exposure as part of the ALERT Extension programme. Through this hands-on experience, they delved deep into the livelihood conditions of the primitive tribes, studying their cultivation techniques, dietary habits, and health standards. Moreover, they had the opportunity to explore the abundant forest resources, including the unique poodu crops grown on the hills.

Experiencing life without modern amenities firsthand, our students gained invaluable insights into the traditional cultures upheld by these tribal communities. Despite facing challenges such as the lack of proper roads, drinking water, and electricity, the tribes demonstrated remarkable sustainability through their age-old practices.



3. EDUCATIONAL SESSION ON MENSTRUAL HYGIENE:

In collaboration with the Yesupadam Charitable Society, an impactful Educational Session on Menstrual Hygiene was organized for women rag pickers at New Rajarajeswari Peta, Vijayawada on March 16, 2023. The session aimed to empower and educate women on crucial aspects of menstrual hygiene. Mr. Joshvua Neeraj, Program Coordinator, and Outreach staff from Yesupadam Charitable Society, along with Mr. R. John, Extension Work Coordinator, actively participated in the program, underscoring the importance of community education.

During the session, Ms. Jessy, a dedicated counselor, conducted a group meeting among the women workers. She provided essential instructions on maintaining proper hygiene during the menstrual period. In cases where sanitary napkins were unavailable, she suggested the use of cloth napkins as an alternative. The information shared by Ms. Jessy was not only well-received but also deemed highly useful by the women in attendance. The session, facilitated by a compassionate lady counsellor, not only addressed practical aspects of menstrual hygiene but also fostered an open and supportive environment for the women to share and learn from one another.



4. FREE MEDICAL CAMP:

As part of the ALERT program, a Free Medical Camp was organized in collaboration with the Yesupadam Charitable Society at Poranki Slum on April 2, 2023. The camp was attended by children and elders from the slum, revealing prevalent health issues such as skin infections, body pains, and instances of malnutrition among the children due to inadequate diets.

During the camp, special attention was given to sensitizing rag pickers about the importance of a nutritious diet and the need for proper sanitation practices in the surrounding areas. Mr. R. John, Extension Coordinator, along with the dedicated staff of Yesupadam Charitable Society, including Mr. Jhasuva Neeraj, Project Coordinator, actively participated in the program. Their combined efforts aimed not only to address immediate health concerns but also to educate and empower the community on sustainable health practices for the well-being of both children and elders. This initiative showcased the commitment of the ALERT program to holistic community development and healthcare awareness.
