## **ROLES AND REPOSIBILITIES**

### FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES

Article 51

It is the duty of the State to direct its policy in the following matters, namely:

### CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

WE THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a Sovereign Socialist Secular Democratic Republic and to secure to all its citizens

**ARTICLE 14**

Equality of status and of opportunity:

State shall secure to all its citizens

**ARTICLE 15**

Prohibition of discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste or sex:

State shall not discriminate on grounds of religion, race, caste or sex in making any law.

**ARTICLE 16**

Equality of opportunity in public employment:

There shall be equality of opportunity to all citizens in matters relating to employment or appointment to any office under the State.

**ARTICLE 17**

Abolition of untouchability:

Untouchability is abolished and its practice in any form is prohibited.

**ARTICLE 18**

Abolition of titles:

No title shall be conferred by the State except military or academic distinctions, which may be conferred by the State on any person in recognition of his or her exceptional services for the State.

**ARTICLE 19**

Protection of certain rights regarding freedom of speech, etc.:

Every citizen shall have the right—

- (a) to freedom of speech and expression;
- (b) to assemble peaceably and without arms;
- (c) to form associations or unions;
- (d) to move freely throughout the territory of India;
- (e) to reside or settle in any part of the territory of India.

**ARTICLE 20**

Protection of rights of certain persons:

Nothing in Articles 14, 15 and 16 shall apply to—

- (a) any member of the Armed Forces of the State;
- (b) any member of the Intelligence Bureau or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (c) any member of the Indian Navy or Indian Air Force or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (d) any member of the Indian Coast Guard or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (e) any member of the Indian Marine or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (f) any member of the Indian Army or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (g) any member of the Indian Air Force or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (h) any member of the Indian Navy or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (i) any member of the Indian Coast Guard or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (j) any member of the Indian Marine or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (k) any member of the Indian Army or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
- (l) any member of the Indian Air Force or any other organisation or body or institution or institution of the State;
